Spring Grass Mat

Materials

- Yarn: worsted weight yarn - 200 yards for the main mat, small amounts of a variety of colors for the flowers.
Sample yarns: Red Heart Super Saver Pretty N Pink, Pumpkin, Bright Yellow, Orchid, Turqua, Spring Green
- Crochet Hook: G (4.5mm), H (5mm), I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends, scissors

Measurements

- Finished Measurements: Big mat - 15" long x 11" wide;
Small mat - 11.5" x 7" wide (see note about hook size)
- Gauge - not necessary for this project

Tips - please take a second to read this section

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

- Reminder: sc 3 = sc one st in each of the next 3 sts; 3sc in next st = work 3sc sts in the next (one) st



Special Stitch

Surface Crochet: insert your hook in designated space, pull up a loop, insert hook into the next space, pull up a loop and through the previous loop. Make sure you do not pull this too snug.

Big Mat (a great size for a 23" porch goose)

This starts with the middle section which is worked back and forth in rows.

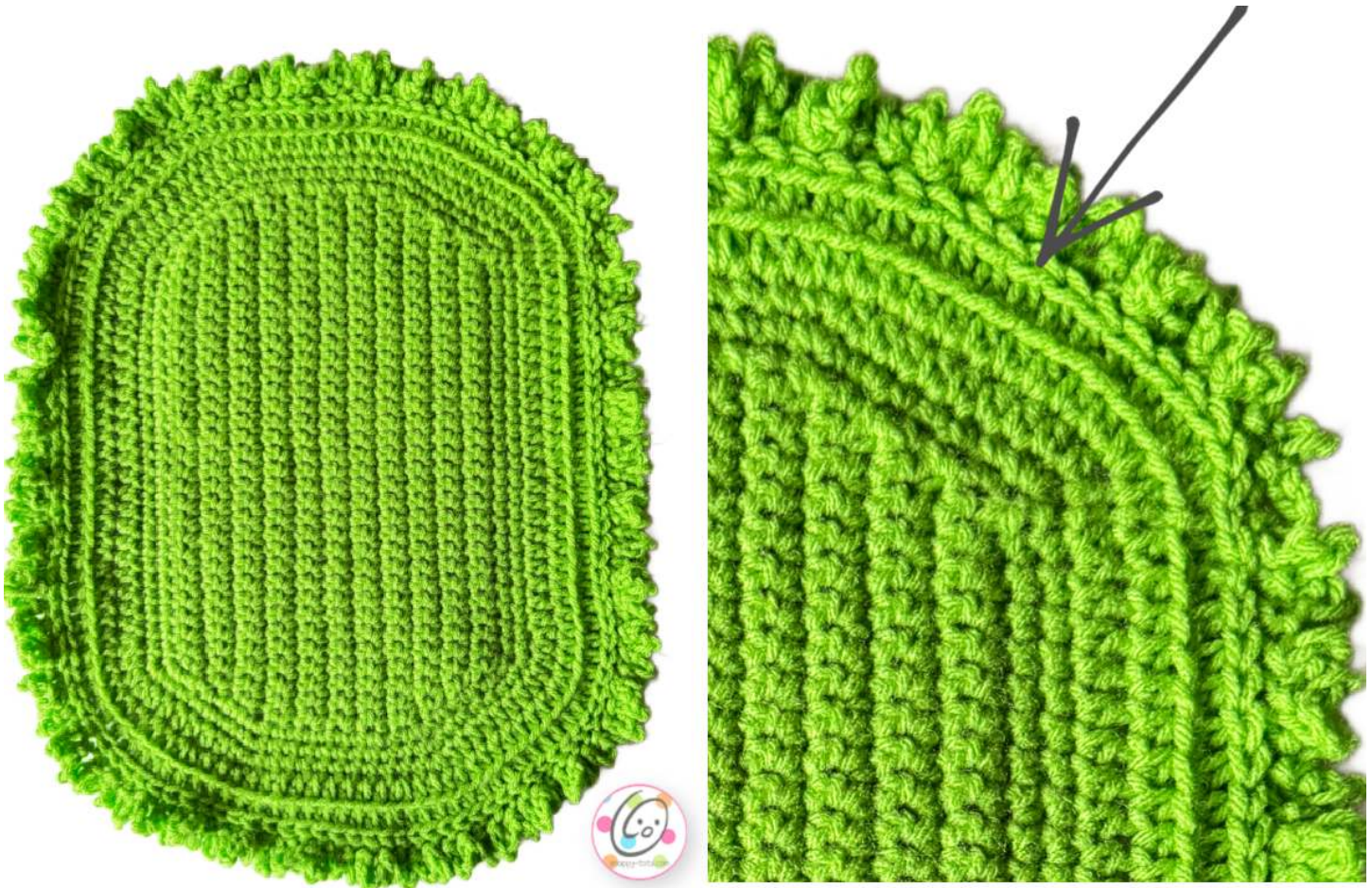
Pay attention to the sts used in this piece. It often changes between sc and hdc.

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn for the middle of the mat (Sample: Spring Green), ch 27, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch until 1 ch remains, 2sc in the last ch. (28sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, sc in each st until 1 st remains, 2sc in the last st. (30sts)
4. Repeat steps 2-3 until there are 34sts in the row.
5. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
6. Repeat the previous row for an additional 7 rows.
7. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (32sts)
8. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
9. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (30sts)
10. Repeat steps 8-9 two more times, until there are 26 sts in the row.
11. This step is worked around the outer edge of the piece. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc 4 sts evenly across the side of the rows (one per row), 2sc in the next spot, sc 9 sts evenly across the side of the rows, 2sc in the next spot, sc 4 sts evenly across the side of the rows, 2sc in the first st of the beginning row, sc 24, 2sc in the last st, sc 4 sts evenly across the side of the rows (one per row), 2sc in the next spot, sc 9 sts evenly across the side of the rows, 2sc in the next spot, sc 4 sts evenly across the side of the rows, 2sc in the first st of the last row (from step 10), sc 24. Sl st in the first st of the round to join. (98sts)
12. Ch 1, 3sc in the same st, *sc 6, 2sc in the next st, sc 9, 2sc in the next st, sc 6, 3sc in the next st, hdc 24*, 3sc in the next st, repeat once, sl st to join. (110sts)
13. Ch 1, *hdc 10, 2sc in the next st, sc 9, 2sc in the next st, hdc 10, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 22, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (118sts)
14. Ch 1, hdc in the same st, *2hdc in the next st, hdc 12*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (127sts)
15. Work this round in BLO + the *third loop, behind the st. The "inner round of grass" will be worked into the remaining front loops of this step.
Ch 1, dc, *2dc in the next st, dc 13*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (136sts)
*Note: Working into "third loop" is optional, but preferred to help prevent the sts from stretching. If you have a hard time finding the "third loop", just work in BLO.
16. This step is the frilly grass outer edge. Change to an H hook for this round. *ch 5, sl st in the next st*, repeat to end of round.



17. Change back to an I hook. This step is worked between the dc posts from step 15, similar to a front post sl st or surface crochet (see “Special Stitches” on page 1). See arrow in photo below. This round helps flatten the mat and give it extra strength.

At this point, the yarn is already at the back of the piece.
Insert your hook between the first two posts of the last round before the chains/grass.
Pull up a loop. Insert the hook between the next 2 posts, pull up a loop and pull it through the first loop.
Insert the hook between the next 2 posts, pull up a loop, and pull it through the previous loop.
Repeat around the mat, making sure the sts stay loose enough the mat doesn't start to pucker.
Finish off and weave in ends.



Inner Layer of Grass

This is worked into the remaining loops from step 15.

With an H hook and matching yarn, start in any loop (see photo below). *ch 7, sl st in the next st, ch 5, sl st in the next st*, repeat to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

Note: I suggest holding the loop/stitch you are working into to help prevent the st from stretching.



Surface Crochet

This step is done similar to step 17. The only difference is we are starting with a new yarn, not one already attached to the mat.

With an I hook, start with the matching yarn behind the piece. We will be working around the posts below the inner layer of grass just completed.

Insert your hook between the first two posts..

Pull up a loop. Insert the hook between the next 2 posts, pull up a loop and pull it through the first loop.

Insert the hook between the next 2 posts, pull up a loop, and pull it through the previous loop.

Repeat around the mat, making sure the sts stay loose enough the mat doesn't start to pucker.

Finish off and weave in ends.

Flowers - Make 8 (or desired amount)

Big Mat - use an I hook; Small Mat - use an H hook

1. With hook and worsted weight yarn color of choice for the center, start with a magic circle of 5 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 5 sc sts), pull closed and sl st to join. (5sts)

2. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

3. Finish off the current yarn and change to the yarn color for the petals. Ch 2, (2dc, ch 3, sl st) in the same st, *ch 2, (2dc, ch 3, sl st) in the next st*, repeat to end of round. (5 petals)

Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing the flowers to the mat.

Place the flowers on the mat as desired. With a yarn needle and yarn tails, sew the flowers to the mat. Note: For the sample, the flowers are sewn around the center only, leaving the petals unattached.



Small Mat

This starts with the middle section which is worked back and forth in rows.
Pay attention to the sts used in this piece. It often changes between sc and hdc.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn for the middle of the mat (Sample: Spring Green), ch 27, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch until 1 ch remains, 2sc in the last ch. (28sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, sc in each st until 1 st remains, 2sc in the last st. (30sts)
4. Repeat steps 2-3 until there are 34sts in the row.
5. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
6. Repeat the previous row for an additional 7 rows.
7. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (32sts)
8. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
9. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (30sts)
10. Repeat steps 8-9 two more times, until there are 26 sts in the row.
11. This step is worked around the outer edge of the piece. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc 4 sts evenly across the side of the rows (one per row), 2sc in the next spot, sc 9 sts evenly across the side of the rows, 2sc in the next spot, sc 4 sts evenly across the side of the rows, 2sc in the first st of the beginning row, sc 24, 2sc in the last st, sc 4 sts evenly across the side of the rows (one per row), 2sc in the next spot, sc 9 sts evenly across the side of the rows, 2sc in the next spot, sc 4 sts evenly across the side of the rows, 2sc in the first st of the last row (from step 10), sc 24. Sl st in the first st of the round to join. (98sts)
12. Ch 1, 3sc in the same st, *sc 6, 2sc in the next st, sc 9, 2sc in the next st, sc 6, 3sc in the next st, hdc 24*, 3sc in the next st, repeat once, sl st to join. (110sts)
13. Ch 1, *hdc 10, 2sc in the next st, sc 9, 2sc in the next st, hdc 10, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 22, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (118sts)
14. Work this round in BLO + the *third loop, behind the st. The “inner round of grass” will be worked into the remaining front loops of this step.
Ch 1, hdc in the same st, *2hdc in the next st, hdc 12*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (127sts)
*Note: Working into “third loop” is optional, but preferred to help prevent the sts from stretching. If you have a hard time finding the “third loop”, just work in BLO.
15. This step is the frilly grass outer edge. Change to a G hook for this round. . *ch 5, sl st in the next st*, repeat to end of round.



16. Change back to an H hook. This step is worked between the dc posts from step 14, similar to a front post sl st or surface crochet (see “Special Stitch” on page 1). See arrow in photo on page 3. This round helps flatten the mat and give it extra strength.

At this point, the yarn is already at the back of the piece.

Insert your hook between the first two posts of the last round before the chains/grass. Pull up a loop. Insert the hook between the next 2 posts, pull up a loop and pull it through the first loop. Insert the hook between the next 2 posts, pull up a loop, and pull it through the previous loop. Repeat around the mat, making sure the sts stay loose enough the mat doesn't start to pucker. Finish off and weave in ends.

Inner Layer of Grass

This is worked into the remaining loops from step 14.

With an H hook and matching yarn, start in any loop (see photo on page 3). *ch 6, sl st in the next st, ch 4, sl st in the next st*, repeat to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

Note: I suggest holding the loop/stitch you are working into to help prevent the st from stretching.

Surface Crochet

This step is done similar to step 16. The only difference is we are starting with a new yarn, not one already attached to the mat.

With an I hook, start with the matching yarn behind the piece. We will be working around the posts below the inner layer of grass just completed.

Insert your hook between the first two posts..

Pull up a loop. Insert the hook between the next 2 posts, pull up a loop and pull it through the first loop.

Insert the hook between the next 2 posts, pull up a loop, and pull it through the previous loop.

Repeat around the mat, making sure the sts stay loose enough the mat doesn't start to pucker.

Finish off and weave in ends.

Flowers: follow instructions on page 5.

Sweetheart Goose Sweater & Headband

Materials

- Yarn: 100 yards each ww yarn in red, white and pink; small amount of light pink. Substitute with colors of choice.
 - Yarns used in the sample: RHSS Cherry, Grenadine, Pretty N Pink, White
- Crochet Hook: I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors

Measurements

- Finished Measurements: From bottom tip of heart to top of neck opening: 11.5" long; 14" wide across bottom edge (measured flat)/ 4.5" wide at top of neck opening
- Gauge - 4" with an I hook = 13 hdc sts and 10 hdc rounds

Tips

- First stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

Sweater

This starts at the neck edge and is worked in rounds to the bottom edge.

Instructions are written for color changes/stripes as shown in the main sample above. Substitute colors as desired.

1. With an I hook and pink yarn, ch 40, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. Make sure the chain is not Twisted. (40sts)
2. Ch 1, hdc in the same ch and in each ch around, sl st in the first st to join. (40sts)
3. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
4. Ch 1, *hdc 19, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (42sts)
5. Ch 1, *hdc 20, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (44sts)
6. Ch 1, *hdc 10, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (48sts)
7. Ch 1, *hdc 11, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (52sts)
8. Ch 1, *hdc 12, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (56sts)
9. Finish off the pink yarn and change to white yarn. Ch 1, *hdc 13, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)
10. Finish off the white yarn and change to red yarn. Ch 1, *hdc 14, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (64sts)
11. Ch 1, *hdc 15, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (68sts)
12. Ch 1, *hdc 16, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (72sts)
13. Finish off the red yarn and change to white yarn. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
14. Ch 1, *hdc 35, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (74sts)
15. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
16. Ch 1, *hdc 36, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (76sts)
17. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
18. Ch 1, *hdc 18, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (80sts)
19. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
20. Finish off the white yarn and change to pink yarn. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
21. Ch 1, *hdc 19, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (84sts)
22. Finish off the pink yarn and change to white yarn. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
23. Finish off the white yarn and change to red yarn. Ch 1, *hdc 20, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (88sts)
24. Ch 1, *hdc 43, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once. (90sts)
25. Ch 1, *hdc 44, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once. (92sts)
26. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
27. Do NOT finish off the red yarn. It will be used for the heart border and does not need to be cut at this point. Change to white yarn. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
28. Finish off the white yarn and change to red yarn. This step creates the hearts along the bottom edge. *Ch 2, (4dc, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 4dc, ch 2, sl st) all in the same st, sl st 4 (one in each of the next 4 sts)*, repeat to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.



Small Heart - make 1 for the chest or many to spread around the white section. These would be cute in different colors to look like conversation hearts.

1. With an I hook and light pink ww yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), sl st to join. (8sts)
2. Sl st in next st, (sc, hdc, dc 2, hdc) in next st, hdc 2, (hdc, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, hdc) in next st, hdc 2, (hdc, dc 2, hdc, sc) in next st, sl st in next sp (between posts) to join. Finish off, leaving a tail for sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the edge of the heart to the middle of the white section.

Headband

With an I hook and white yarn, ch 81, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in the next 24 chs, hdc 30, sc 25. Finish off and weave in ends.

Bow

1. With an I hook and pink yarn (or color of choice), ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (8sts)
 - 2-11. Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st to end of row.
 12. Ch 1, turn, sc in each st to end of row.
 13. This step is worked around the outer edge of the rectangle. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc evenly down the side of the piece, (sc, ch 1, sc) in the first st of the bottom row, sc in each st across, working (sc, ch 1, sc) in the last st. Sc evenly up the side of the piece, (sc, ch 1, sc) in the first st of the top/last row, sc in each st across, sl st in the first st of the round.
 14. This step creates the bumpy edge. *ch 1, sl st in the next st*, repeat around the outer edge. Make sure you aren't skipping a stitch between each sl st. You should be working a sl st into each st with a "ch 1" between each one.
- Finish off and weave in ends.

Heart: Use a long piece of red yarn and a yarn needle to stitch a V shape to one corner for a heart.

Cut a piece of red yarn approximately 24" long. Scrunch the middle of the rectangle together. Tie one end of the yarn to the center back of this piece. Wrap the yarn around the center of the rectangle, cinching in the center, several times, leaving a 12" tail. Secure the yarn at the back and use the remaining tail to sew the bow to the headband.

Place the headband at the middle of the bottom edge of the bow. Use the remaining yarn piece to attach the bow to the headband.

Goose Bunny Costume

Materials

- Yarn for bunny sample: 325 yards ww yarn for main suit (RHSS Pretty N Pink); 30 yards ww yarn for the ears (RHSS Retro Stripes and Petal Pink); 15 yards ww yarn for the pompom tail (or commercial pompom)
- Crochet Hook: G (4-4.5mm), I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends, 4 stitch markers (yarn scraps work for this too)
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors, commercial pompom
- Gauge: 4" with an I hook = 14 hdc sts and 10.5 rounds

Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate the number of rows/rounds.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

Bodysuit

This starts at the bottom of the neck and is worked towards the tail. The top/hood section is added after the body is complete.

1. With an I hook and ww yarn (pink in bunny sample), ch 40, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. Make sure the chain is not twisted.
2. Ch 1, hdc in the same ch and in each ch around, sl st in the first st to join. (40sts)
3. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
4. Ch 1, *hdc 19, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (42sts)
5. Ch 1, *hdc 20, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (44sts)
6. Ch 1, *hdc 10, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (48sts)
7. Ch 1, *hdc 11, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (52sts)
8. Ch 1, *hdc 12, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (56sts)
9. Ch 1, *hdc 13, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)
10. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
11. Ch 1, *hdc 14, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (64sts)
12. Ch 1, *hdc 15, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (68sts)
13. Ch 1, *hdc 16, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (72sts)
14. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
15. Ch 1, *hdc 35, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (74sts)
16. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
17. Ch 1, *hdc 36, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (76sts)
18. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
19. Repeat the previous round for an additional 8 rounds.
20. This step starts a triangle, wedge shape. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc 16, sc2tog. (18sts) Leave remaining sts unworked.
21. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (16sts)
22. Repeat the previous row until 4 sts remain.
23. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc2tog. (2sts)
24. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog. Finish off the yarn.
25. Skip 14 sts on the last full round and attach the yarn to the 15th st (see photo below left). Repeat steps 20-24, but do not finish off the yarn at the end of step 24 this time.



26. This step is worked down the side of the current triangle, across the wider flat edge (not the 14 skipped sts), and up the side of the second triangle.

Ch 1, turn to work from the RS of the piece. Hdc in the same st, hdc 11 sts evenly spaced down the side of the triangle, hdc2tog at the corner (pick up a st from the side and the row), hdc 20, hdc2tog at the corner (pick up a st from the row and the side), hdc 11 sts evenly up the side of the triangle, hdc in the tip of the 2nd triangle. Do not continue down the opposite side of the rectangle. (46sts)

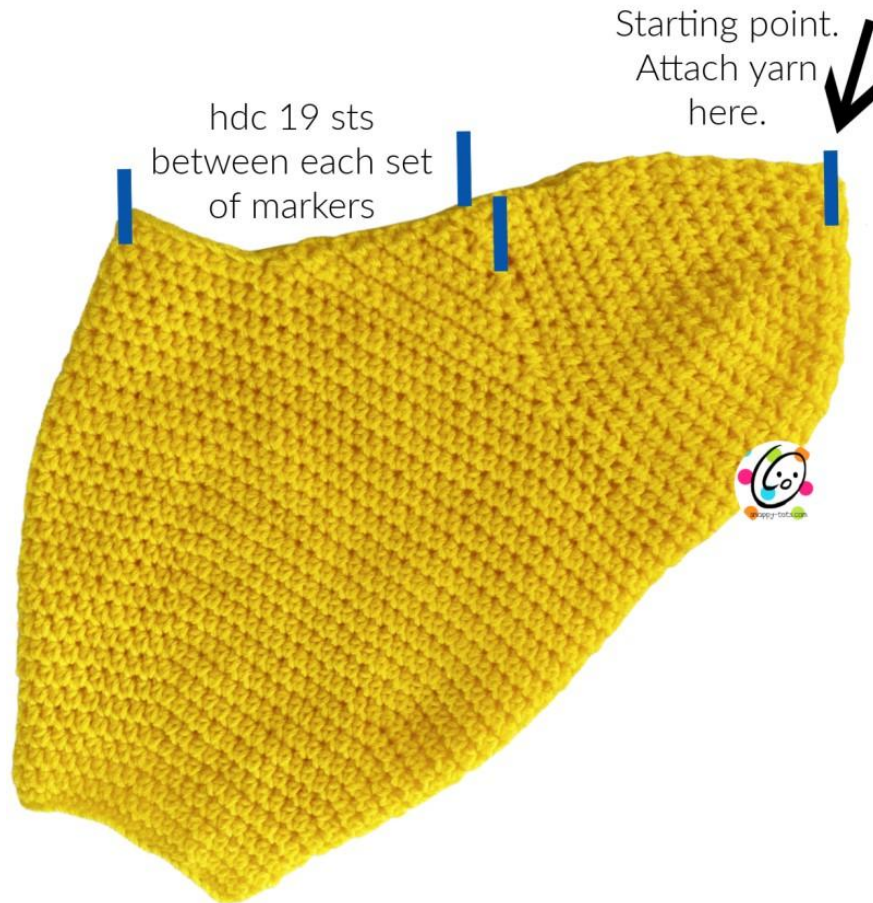


Steps 27-43 are worked back and forth in rows to extend the piece towards the tail. From this point on, work the hdc sts between the posts of the previous row. This will create a smoother fabric and will blend in better with the section worked in rounds.

27. Ch 1, turn, sc 9, hdc 28, sc 9.
28. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 7, hdc 28, sc 7, sc2tog. (44sts)
29. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 7, hdc 26, sc 7, sc2tog. (42sts)
30. Ch 1, turn, sc 8, hdc 26, sc 8.
31. Ch 1, turn, hdc in each st/between the posts to end of row.
- 32-33. Ch 1, turn, hdc between each post to end of row.
34. Ch 1, turn, hdc2tog, hdc 38, hdc2tog. (40sts)
35. Ch 1, turn, *hdc2tog, hdc 8*, repeat to end of row. (36sts)
36. Ch 1, turn, *hdc2tog, hdc 7*, repeat to end of row. (32sts)
37. Ch 1, turn, *hdc2tog, hdc 6*, repeat to end of row. (28sts)
38. Ch 1, turn, *hdc2tog, hdc 5*, repeat to end of row. (24sts)
39. Ch 1, turn, *hdc2tog, hdc 4*, repeat to end of row. (20sts)
40. Ch 1, turn, *hdc2tog, hdc 3*, repeat to end of row. (16sts)
41. Ch 1, turn, *hdc2tog, hdc 2*, repeat to end of row. (12sts)
42. Ch 1, turn, *hdc2tog, hdc*, repeat to end of row. (8sts)
43. Ch 1, turn, *hdc2tog, hdc 2*, repeat once. (6sts). Finish off, leaving a long tail for closing the end.
With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to weave in and out of the remaining sts, pull to close and secure the yarn tail. Remember this point. It is where the yarn will be attached for step 44.



44. This step adds a band to the bottom opening and helps creates the part that will wrap over the tail. First, let's divide the bottom opening into $\frac{1}{4}$ sections to make it easier to work the first round. Fold the piece in half with the tail at one end and the head at the other. Place a marker in the tail point mentioned in step 43. This will be referred to as the "starting stitch point". Divide the bottom edge in 1/4s and place a marker at each point. See the photo below.



With the right side facing, use the same size hook to attach the same yarn to the starting stitch point. Ch 1, hdc 76 sts evenly around the bottom opening, sl st in the first st to join.
Tip: hdc 19sts between each set of markers.

45. Ch 1, *FPHDC around the next post, BPHDC around the next post*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join.
46. Ch 1, FPHDC2tog, BPHDC2tog, *FPHDC around the next post, BPHDC around the next post*, repeat until 4 sts remain, FPHDC2tog, BPHDC2tog. (72sts)
If needed, repeat step 45 to add more rounds. I suggest trying the suit on your goose and smoothing it into place (note on page 6) before adding more rounds.
Finish off and weave in ends.



Neck/Head Section (optional)

1. This part starts the neck section. See the photo at the right for this step. Lay the suit on a flat surface with the feet opening lined up. With an I hook, attach the same yarn to a st on the beginning neck edge at the right. Do not ch 1. Sc in the first st, hdc in each st to end of round. Do not join. Place a marker for working in the round. (40sts)
2. Hdc 8, hdc2tog*, repeat to end of round.(36sts)
3. Hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round.
4. *hdc 7, hdc2tog*, repeat to end of round.(32sts)
5. Hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round.
6. Hdc 14, hdc2tog*, repeat to end of round. (30sts)
7. Hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round.
8. Repeat the previous round for an additional 7 rounds.
9. Sc in the next st, sl st in the next st. This is the new beginning of the round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to the end of the round, sl st to join.



From this point on, work the hdc sts between the posts of the previous row. This will create a smoother fabric and will blend in better with the section worked in rounds.

10. Ch 1, TURN, hdc in the same st, hdc 24. (25sts) Leave the remaining sts unworked.
11. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, hdc 21, sc2tog. (23sts)
12. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st across.
13. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, hdc 19, sc2tog. (21sts)
14. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st across.
15. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, hdc 17, sc2tog. (19sts)
16. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, hdc 15, sc2tog. (17sts)
17. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 13, sc2tog. (15sts)
18. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 11, sc2tog. (13sts)
19. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 9, sc2tog. (11sts)
20. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 7, sc2tog. (9sts)
21. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 5, sc2tog. (7sts)
22. This step is worked around the outer edge of the opening. Ch 1, sc 11 evenly down the side of the opening. Sc2tog at the corner (pick up a st from the side and the bottom row), sc 4, sc2tog (pick up a st from the current row and from the side), sc 11 evenly up the side of the opening, sc2tog, sc 3, sc2tog, sl st to join. Finish off and weave in ends



Pompom Tail: Cut a piece of white yarn 12" long. This will be used to tie around the middle of the pompom. Set aside.

1. Wrap a strand of white yarn around the palm of your hand 60+ times.
2. Carefully slide the loops off your hand.
3. Use the 12" piece to wrap around the middle of the yarn loops and snugly tie a knot.
4. Hold onto the ends of this piece of yarn.
5. Trim the loops and pom as desired.
6. Use the yarn tails to tie the pompom to the tip of the tail.

Ears (make 2)

For the bunny sample, I started with a light pink yarn and then changed to RHSS Retro Stripes.

1. This starts and the center of the ear. With a G hook and ww yarn (light pink in sample), ch 31, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (30sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 19, hdc 9, 3hdc in the last st, 3dc in the edge of the piece, 3hdc in the next st (back of beginning chain), hdc 9, sc 20. (67sts)
Tip: This step is worked in a U shaped. You should work across the row, into the end (for the tip of the ear) and back down the beginning edge.
4. Finish off the current color and change colors if desired (yellow in sample). Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 25, hdc 4, *2dc in the next st, dc*, repeat 2 more times, 2dc in the next st, hdc 4, sc 26. (71sts)
5. Ch 1, turn, sl st in the same st, sl st 24, sc 7, *2hdc in the next st, hdc*, repeat 3 more times, sc 7, sl st 24. (75sts) Finish off, leaving an 8" tail. Set aside.

Place the two ear pieces with right sides together. Line up the sts of the short, flat end. With a yarn needle and matching yarn, sew the edges together.

Choose one of the following options for attaching the ears to the hood:

Option A: Sewn flat - Fold the middle, seamed area in half and sew this section to the top of the hood.

Option B: Middle knot - tie the middle of the ears in a loose knot. With a yarn needle and matching yarn, sew the bottom edge of the knot to the top of the head.

Pompom Pouf For Hair (yellow sample): Cut a piece of matching yarn 12" long. This will be used to tie around the middle of the pompom. Set aside.

1. Wrap a strand of white yarn around the palm of your hand 20 times.
2. Carefully slide the loops off your hand.
3. Use the 12" piece to wrap around the middle of the yarn loops and snugly tie a knot.
4. Hold onto the ends of this piece of yarn.
5. Trim the loops and pom as desired.
6. Use the yarn tails to tie the pompom to the top of the hood.

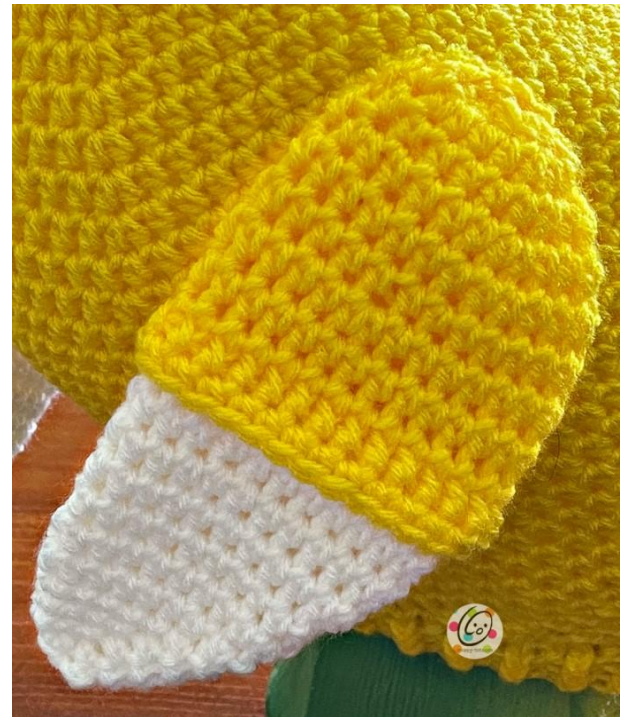


Sleeves (make 2)

The sleeve starts at the top/shoulder.

Leave a long tail in the beginning for attaching sleeve to suit when complete.

1. With an I hook and ww yarn (color to match the suit), start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull to close and place a marker for working in the round. (8sts)
2. 2hdc in each st to end of round. (16sts)
3. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 3*, repeat to end of round. (20sts)
4. Hdc in each st to end of round.
5. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 4*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)
- 6-7. Hdc in each st to end of round.
8. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 11*, repeat once. (26sts)
9. Hdc in each st to end of round.
10. Sc, sl st. This is the new beginning of the round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
11. Ch 1, FPHDC around each post from the previous round, sl st to join.
12. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.
13. The white yarn for the remaining part of the wing will be attached to the inner ridge created from step 11. Pull the top edge back and use an I hook to attach white yarn to a st. See photo for placement. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (26sts)
14. Ch 1, *hdc2tog, hdc 11*, repeat once, sl st to join. (24sts)
15. Ch 1, hdc2tog, hdc in each st until 2 sts remain, hdc2tog, sl st to join. (22sts)
16. Ch 1, hdc2tog, hdc in each st until 2 sts remain, hdc2tog, sl st to join. (20sts)
17. Ch 1, hdc2tog, hdc in each st until 2 sts remain, hdc2tog, sl st to join. (18sts)
18. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
19. Ch 1, hdc2tog, hdc in each st until 2 sts remain, hdc2tog, sl st to join. (16sts)
20. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog, sl st to join. (14sts)
21. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog, sl st to join. (12sts)
22. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog, sl st to join. (10sts)
23. Ch 1, *sc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (5sts) Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing the end. With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to weave in and out of the remaining sts. Pull closed and secure the end.



Notice in the main photo above that one edge of the white wing part tapers towards the end tip and the other stays more straight. Adjust your wing and flatten it to resemble the photo.

Use the beginning yarn tail to sew the top 1" of the shoulder part of each wing to the body suit. This is easiest when the suit is on the goose. See main photos for placement.

NOTE: if the wing tips will be sewn together, make sure the placement of the wings allows for the tips to meet. You will want them to stay snug against the goose so it will be able to hold things.

Use a yarn needle and white (matching) yarn to sew the tips of the wings together if desired.

Smoothing out the suit:
When I first put the suit on it is quite bunched on the neck. If you will take both hands and smooth from the middle of the neck to the middle of his back it makes the suit fit much better.

Blanket Yarn Bath Buddies

These start at the bottom of the buddy.

Yarn: Small amounts of Bernat Blanket yarn

Crochet Hook: K (6.5mm)

Misc: Yarn needle

Bunny

1. With a K hook and Bernat Blanket yarn, ch 2, 8sc in the 2nd ch from hook. Place a marker for working in the round. (8sts)
2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (16sts)
3. *2sc in the next st, sc 7*, repeat once. (18sts)
4. *2sc in the next st, sc 8*, repeat once. (20sts)
- 5-7. Sc in each st to end of round.
8. *sc2tog, sc*, repeat to end of round. (15sts)
9. *sc2tog, sc*, repeat to end of round. (10sts)
10. Sl st in the next st. Flatten the piece, with the current yarn position at the right edge. It is easiest to stitch the eyes and nose at this point. Use a yarn needle and blanket or ww yarn to stitch the features to the center front.

This step seams the top edge together. Working through the stitches of the front and back layers of the top round, ch 1, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog. (3sts)

11. TURN, ch 10, sl st in the next st, ch 10, sl st in the next st.

12. Ch 1, turn, working up the first loop, *sl st 4, ch 2, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook, sl st 5*, sl st between the two ears. Repeat once, then sl st in the same st on the bunny. Finish off and weave in ends.

Bow (optional): With a K hook and blanket yarn, ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in each end. Pull one end through a st at the base of the ear and tie a bow.

Chick

1. With a K hook and Bernat Blanket yarn, ch 2, 8sc in the 2nd ch from hook. Place a marker for working in the round. (8sts)

2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (16sts)

3. *2sc in the next st, sc 7*, repeat once. (18sts)

4. *2sc in the next st, sc 8*, repeat once. (20sts)

5-7. Sc in each st to end of round.

8. *sc2tog, sc*, repeat to end of round. (15sts)

9. *sc2tog, sc*, repeat to end of round. (10sts)

10. Sl st in the next st. Flatten the piece, with the current yarn position at the right edge. It is easiest to stitch the eyes and beak at this point. Use a yarn needle and blanket or ww yarn to stitch the features to the center front.

This step seams the top edge together. Working through the stitches of the front and back layers of the top round, ch 1, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog. (3sts)

11. TURN, ch 5, sl st in the same st, ch 7, sl st in the next st, ch 4, sl st in the next st. Finish off and weave in ends.





Worsted Weight Bath Buddies

If these will be used with water I suggest using 100% cotton yarn.
These start at the bottom of the buddy.

Yarn: Small amounts of worsted weight yarn

Crochet Hook: H (5mm)

Misc: Yarn needle

Bunny

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (8sts)
2. 2hdc in each st to end of round. (16sts)
3. *2hdc in the next st, hdc*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)
- 4-7. Hdc in each st to end of round.
8. *hdc2tog, hdc 4*, repeat to end of round. (20sts)
9. *hdc2tog, hdc 3*, repeat to end of round. (16sts)

10. *sc2tog, sc 28, repeat to end of round. (12sts)

11. Sl st in the next st. Flatten the piece, with the current yarn position at the right edge. It is easiest to stitch the eyes and nose at this point. Use a yarn needle ww yarn to stitch the features to the center front.

This step seams the top edge together. Working through the stitches of the front and back layers of the top round, ch 1, sc2tog, sc2tog, sc2tog. (3sts)

12. TURN, ch 14, sl st in the next st, ch 14, sl st in the next st.

13. Ch 1, turn, working up the first loop, *sl st 6, ch 2, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook, sl st 7*, sl st between the two ears. Repeat once, then sl st in the same st on the bunny. Finish off and weave in ends.

Bow (optional): With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in each end. Pull one end through a st at the base of the ear and tie a bow.

Chick

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (8sts)

2. 2hdc in each st to end of round. (16sts)

3. *2hdc in the next st, hdc*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)

4-7. Hdc in each st to end of round.

8. *hdc2tog, hdc 4*, repeat to end of round. (20sts)

9. *hdc2tog, hdc 3*, repeat to end of round. (16sts)

10. *sc2tog, sc 28, repeat to end of round. (12sts)

11. Sl st in the next st. Flatten the piece, with the current yarn position at the right edge. It is easiest to stitch the eyes and beak at this point. Use a yarn needle ww yarn to stitch the features to the center front.

This step seams the top edge together. Working through the stitches of the front and back layers of the top round, ch 1, sc2tog, sc2tog, sc2tog. (3sts)

12. TURN, ch 7, sl st in the same st, ch 9, sl st in the next st, ch 7, sl st in the next st. Finish off and weave in ends.

Ladybug Goose

Materials

- Yarn: worsted weight in the following colors - 200 yards red, 300 yards black
- Crochet Hook: I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends, long red pipe cleaner (another color could be used and the rounded end could be wrapped with red yarn).
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors

Measurements

- Finished Measurements (measured flat):
Sweater - 12" long x 11" at neck x 13" at bottom edge
Cape - 7" long x 12" at neck, 14-15" at bottom edge
- Gauge - 4" with an I hook = 12.5 hdc sts and 10 hdc rounds/rows

Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

This is designed for a 23" goose statue like the one sold by Miles Kimball.

Photo at right: This is my mom and dad's goose, "Goose". He always has to be different and chose to wear his cape with the opening at the back to look like wings.

Sweater

- This ladybug costume could be made two different ways: as shown with a black sweater and spotted cape OR as a red spotted sweater (no cape).
- This starts at the neck edge and is worked in continuous rounds.

1. The black sweater has a band of red at the top edge. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn (Red Heart Cherry Red in sample), ch 40, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. Make sure the chain is not twisted. Ch 1, sc in each ch to end of round, sl st to join. (40sts)

2-3. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

4. Finish off the red yarn and change to black yarn. Ch 1, *sc 19, 2sc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (42sts)

5. Place a marker for working in the round from this point on. Do not ch 1. Sc in the same st, hdc in the next st and each st to end of round. Do not sl st to join.

6. Hdc in each st to end of round.

7. *hdc 20, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once. (44sts)

11. *hdc 12, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round. (56sts)
12. *hdc 13, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round. (60sts)
13. *hdc 14, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round. (64sts)
14. *hdc 15, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round. (68sts)
15. *hdc 16, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round. (72sts)
16. Hdc in each st to end of round.
17. *hdc 35, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once. (74sts)
18. Hdc in each st to end of round.
19. *hdc 36, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once. (76sts)
20. Hdc in each st to end of round.
21. *hdc 18, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round. (80sts)
22. Hdc in each st to end of round.
23. Sc in the next, sl st in the next st. This is the new beginning of the round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
- 24-26. Ch 1, *FPHDC around the next post, BPHDC around the next post*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.



Ladybug Bonnet

Note: The top sample at the right is from the bumblebee hat, but is made the same way but with a yellow pipe cleaner.

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn (black in sample), ch 33, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (32sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 11, sc2tog, sc 4, sc2tog, sc 12. (30sts)
4. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 10, sc2tog, sc 4, sc2tog, sc 11. (28sts)
5. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
6. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 9, sc2tog, sc 4, sc2tog, sc 10. (26sts)
7. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 9, sc2tog, sc 2, sc2tog, sc 10. (24sts)
8. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
9. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 7, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog, sc 8. (21sts)
10. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 6, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog, sc 6. (18sts)
11. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
12. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 5, sc2tog, sc2tog, sc2tog, sc 6. (15sts)
13. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 4, sc2tog, sc2tog, sc2tog, sc 4. (12sts) Finish off and weave in ends.

With an I hook, attach matching yarn to the bottom corner to work across the edge of the rows. Sc evenly across the edge. This is the bottom edge of the bonnet.

Sc in the first st of the opening edge, ch 1, loosely sl st in each st to end of row, ch 30, finish off. First tie complete.

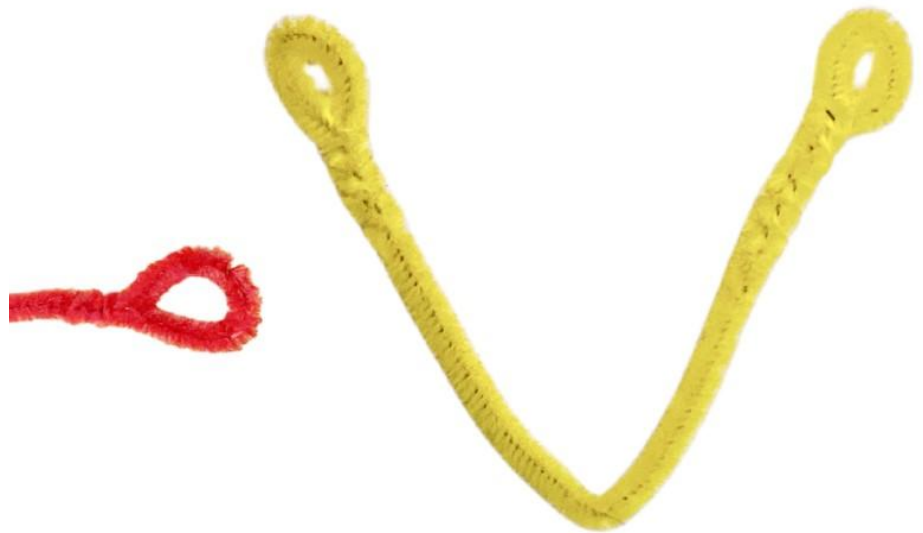
With an I hook, sl st into the opposite corner. Ch 30. Finish off. Second tie complete.

Fold the beginning row, back of hat, in half. With a yarn needle and matching yarn, sew the edges together.



Antenna: Cut a pipe cleaner 9" long. Do not bend the ends yet. The sample pipe cleaners at the right do show the ends bent before wrapping but I found it was easier to slip the antenna through the bonnet when they are straight.

Wrap all of the pipe cleaner, except 1" at either end, with black yarn. Use a yarn needle to pull the yarn tail back through the wraps to secure.



Pull one end of the antenna between posts at the center front of the bonnet until the ends are even. TIGHTLY twist the base of the antenna one time right next to the bonnet.

Bend the ends into loops.

Cape

This starts at the neck edge and is worked back and forth in rows to the bottom edge.

1. With an I hook and red, ch 45, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (44sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, hc in the same st and in each st to end of row.

From this point on, work the sts between the posts of the previous row instead of in the st. This helps create a smoother fabric. To do this, insert the hook just below where you would for a regular st. Check your st count to make sure you are getting all of the sts, especially the very last one.

3. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 10, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 10*, repeat to end of row. (48sts)
4. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 11, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 11*, repeat to end of row. (52sts)
5. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 12, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 12*, repeat to end of row. (56sts)
6. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 13, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 13*, repeat to end of row. (60sts)
7. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 14, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 14*, repeat to end of row. (64sts)
8. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 15, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 15*, repeat to end of row. (68sts)
9. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 16, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 16*, repeat to end of row. (72sts)
10. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 17, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 17*, repeat to end of row. (76sts)
11. Ch 1, turn, hdc between the first 2 posts and between the posts to the end of the row.
12. Repeat the previous row for an additional 7 rows.
13. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first 2 posts, hdc 37, 2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 36, 2dc between the last 2 posts. (79sts)



Note: If you would like a longer cape, repeat step #11.

14. Ch 5, turn, dc in the same st, (dc, ch 2, dc) in each st to end of row. Finish off and weave in ends.

Finishing and Ties

Ties (make 2)

With an H hook, attach matching yarn to the one corner at the neck. Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot near the end of the chain. Weave in the beginning yarn tail. Repeat for the opposite corner of the the cape.

Spots (make 6 or desired amount)

1. With an I hook and black yarn, start with a magic circle of 5 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 5 sc sts), pull closed and sl st to join. (5sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (10sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (15sts) Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

Lay the spots on the cape for placement and pin in place if desired. With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail from each spot to sew the spots to the cape.

Patriotic Goose Outfit



Materials

- Yarn: 100 yards each ww yarn in red, white and blue or colors of choice.
 - Yarns used in the sample: RHSS Cherry, White, Royal
- Crochet Hooks: H (5mm) for stars, I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors

Measurements

- Finished Measurements: 11" long x 16" wide across bottom edge (measured flat)/ 5.5" wide at neck
- Gauge - 2" with an I hook = 6 hdc sts and 5 hdc rounds; 2.5 V st clusters x 3 V st rounds

Tips

- First stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

Shirt

This starts at the neck edge and is worked in rounds to the bottom edge. Substitute colors as desired.

1. With an I hook and blue yarn, ch 40, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. Make sure the chain is not twisted.
2. Ch 1, hdc in the same ch and in each ch around, sl st in the first st to join. (40sts)
3. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
4. Ch 1, *hdc 19, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (42sts)
5. Ch 1, *hdc 20, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (44sts)
6. Ch 1, *hdc 10, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (48sts)
7. Ch 1, *hdc 11, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (52sts)
8. Ch 1, *hdc 12, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (56sts)
9. Finish off the blue yarn. Change to red yarn. Ch 4 (counts as a dc, ch 1), dc in the same st, sk 1, *(dc, ch 1, dc) in the next st, sk 1*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first space to join. (28 V sts)
10. Note: For the following steps, the "space" refers to the middle of the V st from the previous round, between the two dc sts.
Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the same space, *(dc, ch 1, dc) in the next space*, repeat across 13 V st spaces, (dc, ch 1, dc, dc, ch 1, dc) in the next space, *(dc, ch 1, dc) in the next space*, repeat across 13 V st spaces, sl st in the first space to join. (30 V sts)
11. Note: When changing colors, I did not cut the current yarn. Change to white yarn. Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 6 V st spaces, (dc, ch 1, dc, dc, ch 1, dc) in the next V st space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 14 V st spaces, (dc, ch 1, dc, dc, ch 1, dc) in the next V st space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 7 V st spaces, sl st in the first space to join. (32 V sts)
12. Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 15 V st spaces, (dc, ch 1, dc, dc, ch 1, dc) in the next space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 15 V st spaces, sl st in the first space to join. (34 V sts)
13. Change to red yarn. Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 7 V st spaces, (dc, ch 1, dc, dc, ch 1, dc) in the next V st space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 16 V st spaces, (dc, ch 1, dc, dc, ch 1, dc) in the next V st space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 8 V st spaces, sl st in the first space to join. (36 V sts)
14. Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in each V st space to the end of the round, sl st in the first space to join.
15. Change to white yarn. Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in each V st space to the end of the round, sl st in the first space to join.
16. Repeat the previous round.
17. Change to red yarn. Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in each V st space to the end of the round, sl st in the first space to join.
18. Repeat the previous round.
19. Change to white yarn. Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 17 V st spaces, (dc, ch 1, dc, dc, ch 1, dc) in the next space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 17 V st spaces, sl st in the first space to join. (38 V sts)



20. Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 8 V st spaces, (dc, ch 1, dc, dc, ch 1, dc) in the next V st space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 18 V st spaces, (dc, ch 1, dc, dc, ch 1, dc) in the next V st space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next 9 V st spaces, sl st in the first space to join. (40 V sts)
21. Change to red yarn. Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in each V st space to the end of the round, sl st in the first space to join.
22. Repeat the previous round.
23. Ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in the same V st space, sl st in the space before the next V st, *(sc, ch 2, sc) in the next V st space, sl st in the space before the next V st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.

Stars (make 4 white)

1. With an H hook and white yarn, create a magic loop of 5 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 5 sc sts), pull closed and sl st to join. (5sts)
2. *ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in 3rd ch, sl st in next st on circle*, repeat to end of round. (5 points) Finish off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing to wings and bow.

Divide the top, blue section of the shirt in 1/4s and place a marker. With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail from each star to sew one white star to the blue section at each marker.



Top Hat

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Royal Blue in sample), start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for creating a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and sl st in the first st to join. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (16sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (24sts)
4. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (36sts)
5. Ch 1, *sc 5, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (42sts)
6. Ch 1, *sc 6, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (48sts) 3.5" across
7. Work this round in BLO and a little more snug than the previous rounds. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
8. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
9. Ch 1, *hdc 4, hdc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (40sts)
10. Ch 1, *hdc 6, hdc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (35sts)
11. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
12. Do not cut the main yarn. Change yarn for the first round of the hat band (red in the sample). Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
13. Do not cut the red yarn. Change to white yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
14. Do not cut the white yarn. Change to red yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
15. Do not cut the red yarn. Change to white yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
16. Cut the white yarn, leaving a long enough yarn tail to weave in later. Change to red yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
17. Finish off the current yarn and change back to the main color. Work this round in FLO. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
18. Ch 1, *sc 4, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (42sts)
19. Ch 1, *sc 5, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (49sts)
20. Ch 1, *sc 6, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (56sts)



21. Make sure the sts of this round is the same tension as before. Do not ch 1. Sl st in each to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

Chin Strap

Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an H hook and ww yarn (white to match the goose), attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat). Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.

Hat Bow

Follow the star pattern and make one more star with yellow yarn. Set aside.

Colored Loops: With an H hook and red yarn, ch 30, sl st in the last ch from the hook to join into a circle, ch 30, sl st into the same ch as before to create another circle. Place the loops on a flat surface the joined section in the middle. Place the star on top of the middle of the loops.

Use the yellow yarn tail from the star and a yarn needle to sew the middles of the loops to the back of the star.

Use remaining yellow yarn tail to sew the bow to the hat band. See main photo for placement.

Flirty Goose Set

This pattern includes instructions for a skirt, two tops, and a sunhat. Her wig is available in "Goose Wigs", a snappy tots pattern.

Materials

- Worsted weight yarn: approximately 200 yards total. Sample colors: Red Heart Super Saver White, Cherry, Royal
- Crochet Hooks: H (5mm), I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Gauge: 4" with an I hook = 14 hdc sts and 9.5 rows/rounds



Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate the number of rows/rounds.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

Flirty Skirt

This project starts at the top edge and is worked in rounds. Instructions are written with color changes for the blue, white, and red striped skirt. Substitute colors as desired.

Please make sure you are using a worsted weight yarn similar to Red Heart Super Saver. Thinner worsted weight yarns, such as Caron Simply Soft, will greatly affect the size of the piece.



1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn (blue in sample), ch 74, sl st in the last ch from hook to join in the round, making sure the ch is not twisted. (74sts)

2. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (74sts)

Fold in half and measure the piece (side to side). The piece should measure close to 11" across (22" circumference). If it is smaller than 10" across the skirt will not fit your goose and you should go up one size hook. If it is a couple inches bigger (12-13" across) a drawstring can be added to help it stay around the goose. Any bigger than 13" across and I suggest going down a hook size.

3. Ch 1, dc in the same st, dc 35, 2hdc in the next st, dc 36, 2hdc in the next st, sl st in the first st to join. (76sts)

4. Ch 4 (counts as a dc, ch 1), dc in the same st, sk 1, *(dc, ch 1, dc) in the next st, sk 1*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first space to join. (38 V sts)

5. Finish off the blue yarn and change to white yarn. Ch 4, dc in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc) in each V st space to the end of the round, sl st in the first space to join.

6. Ch 4, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the same space, (dc, ch 1, dc, ch 1, dc) in each V st space to end of the round, sl st in the first space to join. These clusters create a W shape. (38 W sts)



7. Finish off the white yarn and change to red yarn. The repeat part of this step is worked across each W from the previous round. The photos below are the same. The one on the right marks the W shape and the arrows show the spaces for the repeat section.

Ch 5, dc in the same sp, ch 2, (dc, ch 2, dc) in the next space (second half of the W), *(dc, ch 2, dc) in the space of the first half of the W, ch 2, (dc, ch 2, dc) in the space of the second half of the W*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first space to join. Finish off and weave in ends.



Tips for step #7:

You are basically working 2 v sts in a row with a ch 2 between them. This forms the W shape.

Make sure you aren't adding an extra "ch 2". The repeat is a (V st, ch 2, V st), NO ch 2, (V st, ch 2, V st) NO ch 2... and so on.

Drawstring (optional)

This is shown in the full blue sample and can be added to help cinch in the top or just because you want to.

With an I hook and ww yarn (white in sample), ch 155, finish off and tie a knot in each end.

Use a yarn needle or crochet hook (or a safety pin works too), to pull one end of the drawstring in and out of the DC round near the top of the skirt. I chose to go *under 2 posts, over 1 post* repeated all the way around. Tie a bow.

Stars (optional)

There are 3 red stars and 3 white stars on the sample skirt.

1. With an I hook and ww yarn, create a circle of 5 sc sts (or preferred method of creating a circle of 5 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (5sts)

2. *ch 3, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook, hdc in the next ch, sl st in the next st on the circle*, repeat to end of round. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing to the skirt.

Place the stars evenly around the top section of the skirt, alternating colors. Use a yarn needle and each yarn tail to sew the stars in place.



Tops

There are two different tops. The main difference is the striped one is wide across the back and the solid red one narrows across the back to create more of a bra top. Both tops can be worn pull down, almost flat against the goose or left loose for a fuller-figured goose.



Tube Top (Striped)

1. With an I hook and red yarn, ch 60, sl st in the last ch from hook to join in the round, making sure the ch is not twisted. (60sts)
2. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
3. Do not finish off the red yarn. Change to white yarn. For the sample, I carried the unused yarn on the wrong side of the piece. This way there won't be as many ends to weave in.
Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 3, *hdc 13, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (64sts)
Note: The sc 4 sts create a valley which will be worn in the front. A separate band will be added around this section when the tube is complete.
4. Do not finish off the white yarn. Change back to the red yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 3, hdc 60, sl st in the first st to join.
5. Change back to the white yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 3, *hdc 14, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (68sts)
6. Change back to the red yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 3, hdc 64, sl st in the first st to join.
7. Change back to the white yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 3, *hdc 15, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (72sts)
8. Change back to the red yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 3, hdc 68, sl st in the first st to join.
9. Change back to the white yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 3, *hdc 16, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (76sts)
10. Finish off the white yarn. Change back to the red yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 3, hdc 72, sl st in the first st to join.
11. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.

Center band

1. With an I hook and red yarn, ch 9, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st across. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

Gather the middle/sc 4 section of the tube and wrap the center band piece around it. Use the yarn tail and a yarn needle to sew the short ends of the band together. Twist the center band so the seam is on the inside/wrong side of the top.

The beginning edge is the top and should be at the neck when worn.

Bra Top (Solid)**Tube Top (Striped)**

1. With an I hook and red yarn, ch 60, sl st in the last ch from hook to join in the round, making sure the ch is not twisted. (60sts)
2. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 11, hdc, 2dc in the next st, dc 12, 2dc in the next st, hdc, sc 4, hdc, 2dc in the next st, dc 12, 2dc in the next st, hdc, sc 12, sl st in the first st to join. (64sts)
3. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 11, hdc, dc 16, hdc, sc 4, hdc, dc 16, hdc, sc 12, sl st in the first st to join.
4. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 5, 2sc in the next st, sc 5, hdc, 2dc in the next st, dc 14, 2dc in the next st, hdc, sc 4, hdc, 2dc in the next st, dc 14, 2dc in the next st, hdc, sc 5, 2sc in the next st, sc 6, sl st in the first st to join. (70sts)
5. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 12, hdc, dc 18, hdc, sc 4, hdc, dc 18, hdc, sc 13, sl st in the first st to join.
6. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 6, 2sc in the next st, sc 6, hdc, 2dc in the next st, dc 16, hdc, sc 4, hdc, dc 16, 2dc in the next st, hdc, sc 6, 2sc in the next st, sc 7, sl st in the first st to join. (74sts)
7. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 14, hdc, dc 18, hdc, sc 4, hdc, dc 18, hdc, sc 15, sl st in the first st to join.
8. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 6, 2sc in the next st, sc 7, hdc, 2dc in the next st, dc 17, hdc, sc 4, hdc, dc 17, 2dc in the next st, hdc, sc 7, 2sc in the next st, sc 7, sl st in the first st to join. (78sts)
9. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.

Center band

1. With an I hook and red yarn, ch 9, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st across. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

Gather the middle/sc 4 section of the tube and wrap the center band piece around it. Use the yarn tail and a yarn needle to sew the short ends of the band together. Twist the center band so the seam is on the inside/wrong side of the top.

The beginning edge is the top and should be at the neck when worn.



Sunhat



1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (red in sample), start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for creating a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and sl st in the first st to join. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (16sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc 3, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (20sts)
4. Ch 1, *sc 3, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (25sts)
5. Ch 1, *sc 4, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (30sts)
6. Do not finish off the current yarn. Change to white yarn for this round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
7. Do not finish off the current yarn. Change back to red yarn for this round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
8. Finish off the red yarn. Change to white yarn for this round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
9. Finish off the white yarn. Change to blue yarn for the rest of the hat. Ch 1, *FPHDC around each of the next 4 posts, 2FPHDC around the next post*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36sts)
10. Ch 1, *sc 3, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (45sts)
11. Ch 1, *sc 4, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (54sts)

12. Ch 1, sc 2, *2sc in the next st, sc 4*, repeat until 2 sts remain, sc 2, sl st to join. (64sts)

13. Sl st in each st to end of round, sl st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.

Chin Strap

Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an H hook and ww yarn (royal in sample), attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat).

Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.

Melon Version

Yarns used in sample: Red Heart Super Saver Cherry, Spring Green, Paddy Green, White

1-7. Red yarn

8. White

9. Medium green

10. Lime green

11-13. Medium green

Seeds: Create the seeds by taking a few sts in random places on the red area with a yarn needle and black yarn.

The top was made in red with seeds stitched with black yarn.

Goose Cozy Coffee Time

Materials

- Yarn: The sweater is made with 2 strands worsted weight yarn held together for the entire sweater. Thicker yarn equivalent to 2 strands worsted weight could be substituted. 250 yards worsted weight yarn

Sample Colors: Red Heart Super Saver - 100 yards Aran, 100 yards Oatmeal, 60 yards Burgundy, 60 yards for the hair (Cafe + Buff in sample)

- Crochet Hooks: H (5mm), I (5.5mm), J (6mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors, 1-2 hair elastics
- Coffee Cup: small amount of stuffing, less than 20 yards each of cream, tan, dark brown

Measurements

- Finished Measurements:
Sweater - 10.75" long x 14" across bottom edge.
- Gauge - 4" with 2 strands + J hook = 12 hdc sts and 8 hdc rounds

Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

This is designed for a 23" goose statue like the one sold by Miles Kimball.



Sweater

This starts at the neck edge and is worked in rounds to the bottom edge.

1. With a J hook and two strands worsted weight yarn (Sample: 1 strand Aran + 1 strand Oatmeal), ch 40, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. Make sure the chain is not twisted. (40sts)
2. Ch 1, hdc in the same ch and in each ch to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
3. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
4. Repeat the previous round for an additional 5 rounds.
5. Fold the piece in half matching the sts from the current round to the sts from the beginning ch. Working through sts from both layers, ch 1, *hdc 9, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (44sts)
6. Ch 1, *hdc 10, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (48sts)
7. Ch 1, *hdc 7, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (54sts)
8. Ch 1, *hdc 8, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (60sts)
9. Ch 1, *hdc 9, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (66sts)
10. Finish off the current yarns and change to yarns for the chest stripe (Sample: 2 strands Burgandy). Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
11. Ch 1, *hdc 10, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (72sts)
12. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
13. Ch 1, *hdc 11, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (78sts)
14. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
15. Repeat the previous round.
16. Finish off the current yarns and change to yarns for the bottom section (Sample: 1 strand Aran + 1 strand Oatmeal). Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
17. Repeat the previous round for an additional 7 rounds.
18. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.



Messy Bun Beanie

These open top beanies are one of my most favorites because I often have my hair in a ponytail and end up wearing headbands. I thought it would be fun to make our goose a messy bun beanie too.

This is worked from the bottom edge of the beanie to the top opening. Earflaps are added last.

1. With an I hook and one strand worsted weight yarn (Sample: Burgundy), ch 30, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. Make sure the chain is not twisted. (30sts)
2. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
3. Change to yarn for the stripe (Sample: Aran). Note: I did not cut the beginning yarn since I used it after this round.
Ch 1, FPHDC around each post to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
4. Finish off the current yarn and change back to the beginning yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
5. Ch 1, *sc, sc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (20sts)
6. Ch 1, *sc 3, sc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (16sts)
7. Ch 1, sc, *sc2tog, sc 3*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (13sts) Finish off and weave in ends.
8. This step starts the first earflap. Use the same hook and yarn to start in any st on the bottom edge of the beanie. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 6. Leave the remaining sts unworked. (7sts)
9. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 3, sc2tog. (5sts)
10. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog. (3sts)
11. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc. (2sts)
12. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog. Finish off and weave in ends.
13. Skip 8 sts on the bottom edge of the beanie from the last st on step 8. Repeat steps 8-12.
14. After the last earflap do not finish off. Ch 1, sc 4 sts evenly spaced up the side of the earflap, sc in each st on the bottom edge of the beanie, sc 4 sts evenly spaced down the side of the earflap, 2sc in the tip of the earflap, sc 4 sts evenly spaced up the side of the earflap, sc in each st on the bottom edge of the beanie, sc 4 sts evenly spaced down the side of the earflap, sl st in the first st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.

Braids

Cut 12 pieces of yarn 15" long. Set 6 pieces aside for the second braid.

For the sample, there are 2 cream and 4 red per braid.

Pull the yarn tails through the tip of one earflap until the ends are even. Divide the strands in thirds and braid. Tie a knot near the bottom of the braid. Trim the ends of the braids as desired.



The “Hair”

I have designed this so you can style the hair multiple ways.

1. The “hair” strands are attached the ridge on the inside/wrong side of the beanie created by working the front post sts on step 3. Turn the beanie inside out.
2. Cut 60 strands of yarn, 28” long. I used two shades of brown (Buff, Cafe). There are 30 sts on this round and I attached 2 strands to each st.
3. Fold 2 strands in half and use a crochet hook to pull the center loops through one of the sts on the ridge mentioned on step 1. Pull the yarn ends through the loops until the loops are snug against the st.
4. Repeat for each st on the ridge. See photo at right.
5. Pull the strands of yarn apart. This makes the yarn look less like yarn, plus gives it a fuller, frizzy appearance.



Tip: I found it easiest to hold the beanie between my knees and start close to the beanie when pulling the strands apart. In the photo I am using one hand because my other hand was taking the photo. Usually I use both hands to gently pull the strands apart.

Once the hair is complete, carefully pull all of the strands through the top hole.

Styling The Hair

Once it is pulled through, it can be left down, pulled up into a hair elastic, or made into a messy bun (or two buns).



How I Make A Messy Bun: I wear my hair in 1 or 2 messy buns quite often.

Use a hair elastic to wrap around the base of the hair (as it comes out of the hat), 2 or more times until you can wrap it only one more time. On the last wrap I like to be on the top of the head (as shown in the photo at left). Pull the hair elastic over the top of the hair, forming the bun. Do not pull the hair all the way through.

Wrap the remaining hair around the base of the bun and either tuck under the hair elastic or use another elastic over the top of the bun to hold in all those extras.

Two messy buns are done the same way, just divide the hair first.

Sleeves (make 2)

The sleeve starts at the top/shoulder.

Leave a long tail in the beginning for attaching sleeve to robe when complete.

1. With a J hook and 2 strands worsted weight yarn (Sample: 1 strand Aran + 1 strand Oatmeal), start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull to close and place a marker for working in the round. (8sts)
 2. 2hdc in each st to end of round. (16sts)
 3. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 3*, repeat to end of round. (20sts)
 4. Hdc in each st to end of round.
 5. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 4*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)
 - 6-7. Hdc in each st to end of round.
 8. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 11*, repeat once. (26sts)
 9. Hdc in each st to end of round.
 10. Repeat the previous round 4 more times.
 11. Sc, sl st. This is the new beginning of the round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
 12. Ch 1, FPHDC around each post from the previous round, sl st to join.
 13. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
 14. Repeat the previous round for an additional 6 rounds.
 15. LOOSELY sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.
 16. This step starts the white, wing part. Fold back the end of the sleeve until the ridge from the post stitches on step 12 are accessible. With an I hook, attach 1 strand of white yarn to a st on the ridge. See photo. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (26sts)
 17. Ch 1, *hdc 11, hdc2tog*, repeat once, sl st to join. (24sts)
 18. Ch 1, *sc 10, sc2tog*, repeat once, sl st to join. (22sts)
 19. Ch 1, *sc 9, sc2tog*, repeat once, sl st to join. (20sts)
 20. Ch 1, *sc 8, sc2tog*, repeat once, sl st to join. (18sts)
 21. Ch 1, *sc 7, sc2tog*, repeat once, sl st to join. (16sts)
 22. Ch 1, *sc 6, sc2tog*, repeat once, sl st to join. (14sts)
 23. Ch 1, *sc 5, sc2tog*, repeat once, sl st to join. (12sts)
 24. Ch 1, *sc, sc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (8sts)
- Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing the end closed.
With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to weave in and out of the remaining sts. Pull closed and secure the end.



Notice in the photo that one edge of the white wing part tapers towards the end tip and the other stays more straight. Adjust your wing and flatten it to resemble the photo. The cuff is approximately 2”.

Use the beginning yarn tail to sew the top 1” of the shoulder part of each wing to the sweater. This is easiest when the sweater is on the goose. See photos for placement.

Tip: I like to put the sweater on the goose, pin the sleeves in place, and set the goose across the room. Look at it from different angles and adjust if needed.



Coffee Tumbler 3.75" tall x 3" across top**Cup Section**

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Aran), start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (16sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts)
4. Ch 1, *sc 5, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (28sts)
5. Ch 1, sc in BLO to end of round, sl st to join.
6. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
7. Repeat the previous round for an additional 3 rounds.
8. Change yarn for the middle stripe. Ch 1, sc in FLO to end of round, sl st to join.
9. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
10. Repeat the previous round for an additional round.
11. Ch 1, *sc 13, 2sc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (30sts)
12. Finish off the current yarn and change to beginning yarn. Ch 1, sc in BLO to end of round, sl st to join.
13. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
14. Repeat the previous round for an additional 2 rounds. Finish off and set aside.

Lid Section

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Coffee), start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (16sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts)
4. Ch 1, *sc 5, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (28sts)
5. Ch 1, *sc 6, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (32sts)
6. Ch 1, *BPHDC 7, 2BPHDC around the next post*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36sts)
7. Sl st in each st to join. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing the pieces together.

Stuff the cup section. Place the lid on top and pin together. With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the lid on top of the cup.

Wrap a wing around the cup. Either pin or sew the wing to the cup and the cup to the sweater.

Wizard Goose

- Yarn: 300 yards worsted weight yarn. Substitute with colors of choice.
 - Yarns used in the sample: Red Heart Super Saver Black (150 yds), Cafe Late, Light Grey (50 yards), Paddy Green (50 yards), White
- Crochet Hook: H (5mm), I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends, 1" button, sewing needle, matching thread
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissor, applique
- Books (per book): 2 pieces 5 x 7" chipboard, balsa wood, or similar for the inside of the books; Decopauge or craft glue, paint brush, varnish; strong glue; light sand paper

Measurements

- Finished Measurements: (measured flat) Sweater: 8" from neck to bottom, 13.5-14" wide across bottom edge; Hood - 9.5" from neck to top of hood
- Gauge - 4" with an I hook = 13 hdc sts and 10 hdc rounds

Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

Jacket

This starts at the neck edge and is worked back and forth in rows. The hood is added last.

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn (Black in sample), ch 41, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (40sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc in the same st, hdc 9, *2hdc in the next st, hdc 9*, repeat to end of row. (44sts)

From this point on, work the sts between the posts of the previous row instead of in the st. This helps create a smoother fabric. To do this, insert the hook just below where you would for a regular st. Check your st count to make sure you are getting all of the sts, especially the very last one.

3. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 10, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 10*, repeat to end of row. (48sts)
4. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 11, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 11*, repeat to end of row. (52sts)
5. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 12, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 12*, repeat to end of row. (56sts)
6. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 13, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 13*, repeat to end of row. (60sts)
7. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 14, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 14*, repeat to end of row. (64sts)
8. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 15, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 15*, repeat to end of row. (68sts)
9. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 16, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 16*, repeat to end of row. (72sts)
10. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 17, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 17*, repeat to end of row. (76sts)
11. Ch 1, turn, hdc between the first 2 posts and between the posts to the end of the row.
12. Repeat the previous row for an additional 7 rows.
13. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 18, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 18*, repeat to end of row. (80sts)
- 14-15. Ch 1, turn, hdc between the first 2 posts and between the posts to the end of the row.
16. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 19, *2hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 19*, repeat to end of row. (84sts)
- 17-18. Ch 2, turn, dc between the first 2 posts and between the posts to the end of the row.
19. Ch 1, turn, 2dc between the first two posts from the previous row, dc 20, *2dc between the next 2 posts, dc 20*, repeat to end of row. (88sts)
- 20-21. Ch 1, turn, dc between the first 2 posts and between the posts to the end of the row.
22. Ch 1, turn, 2dc between the first two posts from the previous row, dc 21, *2dc between the next 2 posts, dc 21*, repeat to end of row. (92sts)
23. Ch 1, turn, dc between the first 2 posts and between the posts to the end of the row.
24. Repeat the previous row for an additional 3 rows.
25. Ch 1, turn, hdc IN each st to end of row. Finish off and weave in ends.



Hood

1. With the right side/outside of the hoodie towards you, use an I hook to attach matching yarn to the first st on the top row. Ch 1, sc2tog, hdc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (38sts)

Note: Since the hood is worked back and forth in rows, work the following sts between the posts as in the main part of the hoodie for a smoother fabric.

2. Ch 1, sc2tog, hdc between the posts until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (36sts)

3. Ch 1, sc2tog, hdc between the posts until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (34sts)

4-5. Ch 1, turn, hdc between the posts to end of row.

6. Ch 1, sc2tog, hdc between the posts until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (32sts)

7-8. Ch 1, turn, hdc between the posts to end of row.

9. Ch 1, sc2tog, hdc between the posts until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (30sts)

10-11. Ch 1, turn, hdc between the posts to end of row.

12. Ch 1, sc2tog, hdc between the posts until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (28sts)

13. Ch 1, turn, hdc between the posts to end of row.

14. Repeat the previous step for an additional 14 rows. Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail.

Fold the top edge of the hood in half, right sides together. With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the layers together. Open the hood back up.

With an I hook and from the right side, attach matching yarn to a corner on the bottom. Ch 1, sc in each st across the bottom edge. 3sc in the corner, sc evenly up the opening, including the hood, and down the other side. Sl st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.

Optional: Add a pompom to the back point of the hood.

Closure: With an H hook and black yarn, ch 15, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (14sts) Finish off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing to the jacket.

Fold the strip in half to form a loop. With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the ends to one edge of the jacket approximately 2" from the neck.

With a sewing needle and matching thread, sew a button straight across from the loop on the opposite edge of the jacket.

Sleeves (make 2)

The sleeve starts at the top/shoulder.

Leave a long tail in the beginning for attaching sleeve to suit when complete.

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn to match the jacket (black in sample), start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull to close and place a marker for working in the round. (8sts)

2. 2hdc in each st to end of round. (16sts)

3. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 3*, repeat to end of round. (20sts)

4. Hdc in each st to end of round.

5. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 4*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)

6-7. Hdc in each st to end of round.

8. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 11*, repeat once. (26sts)

9. Hdc in each st to end of round.



10. Sc, sl st. This is the new beginning of the round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
11. Ch 1, FPHDC around each post from the previous round, sl st to join. Slip the loop off the hook. This part will be finished after the white part of the wing is complete.
12. The white yarn for the remaining part of the wing will be attached to the inner ridge created from step
13. Pull the top edge back and use an I hook to attach white yarn to a st.
Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (26sts)
14. Ch 1, *hdc2tog, hdc 11*, repeat once, sl st to join. (24sts)
15. Ch 1, hdc2tog, hdc in each st until 2 sts remain, hdc2tog, sl st to join. (22sts)
16. Ch 1, hdc2tog, hdc in each st until 2 sts remain, hdc2tog, sl st to join. (20sts)
17. Ch 1, hdc2tog, hdc in each st until 2 sts remain, hdc2tog, sl st to join. (18sts)
18. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
19. Ch 1, hdc2tog, hdc in each st until 2 sts remain, hdc2tog, sl st to join. (16sts)
20. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog, sl st to join. (14sts)
21. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog, sl st to join. (12sts)
22. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog, sl st to join. (10sts)
23. Ch 1, *sc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (5sts) Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing the end.
With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to weave in and out of the remaining sts. Pull closed and secure the end.

Finishing the sleeve:

1. Slip the black loop back on the hook. Ch 1, *hdc 12, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (28sts)
- 2-3. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
4. Ch 1, 2hdc in the same st, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (29sts)
5. Ch 1, 2hdc in the same st, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (30sts)
6. Loosely sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

Notice in the main photo above that one edge of the white wing part tapers towards the end tip and the other stays more straight. Adjust your wing and flatten it to resemble the photo.

Use the beginning yarn tail to sew the top 1" of the shoulder part of each wing to the body suit. This is easiest when the suit is on the goose. See main photos for placement.

Tip: I like to put the jacket on the goose, pin the sleeves in place, and set the goose across the room. Look at it from different angles and adjust if needed.

If the goose will be holding something, the white tips can be sewn together or just one (or both) sewn to the jacket (as shown in the sample).



Scarf

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (green in sample), ch 9, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (8sts)
2. Ch 2, turn, dc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Repeat the previous row until scarf is desired length.
4. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row. Finish off and weave in ends.

Color sequence for sample: 15 stripes of 4 dc rows each. Finish off the color when changing to the new yarn.



Fringe: Cut several strands of yarn 10" long. Fold two strands in half. Use a crochet hook to pull the center loops through a st at the end of the scarf. Pull the tails through the loops until snug against the scarf. Repeat across both ends.

Trim ends.

Hat

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn (tan in sample), start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and place a marker for working in the round. (6sts)
2. Sc in each st to end of round.
3. *2sc in the next st, sc 2*, repeat once. (8sts)
4. Sc in each st to end of round.
5. *2sc in the next st, sc 3*, repeat once. (10sts)
6. Sc in each st to end of round.
7. *2sc in the next st, sc 4*, repeat once. (12sts)
8. Sc in each st to end of round.
9. *2sc in the next st, sc 3*, repeat to end of round. (15sts)
10. *2sc in the next st, sc 4*, repeat to end of round. (18sts)
11. Sc in each st to end of round.
12. *2sc in the next st, sc 5*, repeat to end of round. (21sts)
13. Sc in each st to end of round.
14. *2sc in the next st, sc 6*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)
15. Sc in each st to end of round.
16. *2sc in the next st, sc 7*, repeat to end of round. (27sts)
17. Sc in each st to end of round.
18. *2sc in the next st, sc 8*, repeat to end of round. (30sts)
- 19-20. Sc in each st to end of round.
21. Sl st in the next st. This is the new beginning of the round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
22. Ch 1, *FPHDC around each of the next 4 posts from the previous round, 2FPHDC around the next post*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36sts)
23. Ch 1, *sc 3, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (45sts)
24. Ch 1, *sc 4, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (54sts)
25. Ch 1, *sc 8, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)
26. Ch 1, *hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (70sts)
27. Do not ch at the beginning of this round. Sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

"Face"/Folds on front

Use a yarn needle and matching yarn to weave in and out of the sts up one side of the hat. See photo at right.

Secure one end of the yarn to the inside of the hat. Pull the other end until hat is folded as much as desired. Secure this yarn tail on the inside of the hat.

Ties: Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an H hook and worsted weight white yarn (to match the goose), attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat). Ch 40. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.



Books

- These could be made from a variety of materials so please substitute as needed.
- I would not expose these to the outside and weather.
- Keep the books fairly thin and lightweight or your goose will get tired of holding them for a long time.

1. Start by finding the book covers you will be using. It is easier to cut the insides to match the size of the covers.

Sample covers were downloaded from this site:

Please make sure you check the site for usage restrictions. I made mine for a gift.

Real book covers could be used. He could also hold any books you might already own.

2. Open the covers and print on regular copy paper. If you have a specific size in mind you will want to open the file in a photo editing program such as canva, photoshop, picmonkey.

3. Cut 2 pieces for the inside “pages” (thin balsa wood, chipboard, or similar) to fit the cover. NOTE: remember there is a spine to the book. See the close up below.

4. Stack the inside “pages” and wrap the cover around to check once again to make sure it is the thickness you desire. Glue the inside “pages” together with a strong glue. Allow to dry.

5. Wrap the cover around the inside “pages”. Choose one of the options below:

Decopauge (used in samples): following instructions on the product, use a paint brush to coat the top of the book. Allow to dry. I did not glue the cover to the spine.

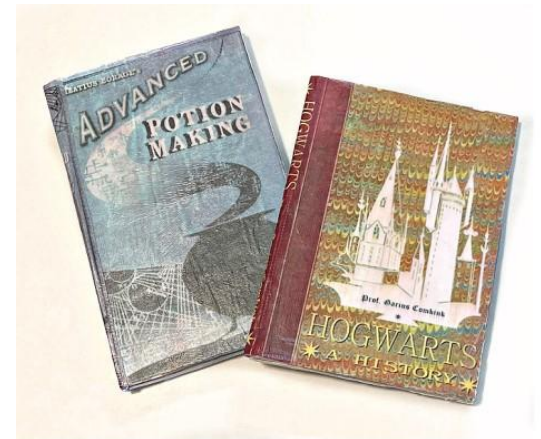
Repeat for the back of the book.

Allow to thoroughly dry. Lightly sand the edges for a worn look.

Glue and Varnish: Use a craft glue attach the cover front and back.

Use a brush on varnish to coat the entire cover.

Allow to thoroughly dry. Lightly sand the edges for a worn look.

Witch Goose Costume

Materials

- Yarn: Substitute with colors of choice.
 - Yarns used in the sample: 150 yards Red Heart Super Saver Black, 20 yards Turqua, 50 yards Amethyst, 50 yards RHSS Pumpkin
- Crochet Hook: H (5mm), I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors

Measurements

- Finished Measurements: Cape - 8" from top edge to tip of peak; Dress - 11.5" from top to bottom, 14" across bottom edge; Hat - 4" from top of hat to bottom edge of hat band.
- Gauge - 4" with an I hook = 14 hdc sts and 9.5 hdc rounds

Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

This is designed for a 23" goose statue like the one sold by Miles Kimball.

Cape

This starts at the neck edge and is worked back and forth in rows to the bottom edge.

As written, the cape is 8" long from the top edge of the collar to the tip of a peak. For a longer cape, add rows to step 15.

1. With an I hook and ww black yarn, ch 41, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (40sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Repeat the previous step for an additional 5 rows.
4. This step is worked in BLO. Ch 1, turn, sc in the BLO of each st to end of row.
5. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc in the same st, hdc 9, *2hdc in the next st, hdc 9*, repeat to end of row. (44sts)

From this point on, work the sts between the posts of the previous row instead of in the st. This helps create a smoother fabric. To do this, insert the hook just below where you would for a regular st. Check your st count to make sure you are getting all of the sts, especially the very last one.

6. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 10, *2 hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 10*, repeat to end of row. (48sts)
 7. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 11, *2 hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 11*, repeat to end of row. (52sts)
 8. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 12, *2 hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 12*, repeat to end of row. (56sts)
 9. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 13, *2 hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 13*, repeat to end of row. (60sts)
 10. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 14, *2 hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 14*, repeat to end of row. (64sts)
 11. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 15, *2 hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 15*, repeat to end of row. (68sts)
 12. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 16, *2 hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 16*, repeat to end of row. (72sts)
 13. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 17, *2 hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 17*, repeat to end of row. (76sts)
 14. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc between the first two posts from the previous row, hdc 18, *2 hdc between the next 2 posts, hdc 18*, repeat to end of row. (80sts)
 - 15-17. Ch 1, turn, hdc between the first 2 posts and between the posts to the end of the row.
 18. This step is worked IN the stitch, not between the posts. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, hdc, dc, (tr, ch 3, sl st in the 3rd ch from hook, tr) in the next st, dc, hdc, sc, sl st, *sc in the next st, hdc, dc, (tr, ch 3, sl st in the 3rd ch from hook, tr) in the next st, dc, hdc, sc, sl st* repeat to end of row.
 19. This step is worked around the outer edge of the cape. Do not turn. Working up the side of the cape, evenly sl st across. Ch 1, sc in the first st of the top row, *ch 1, sc in the next st*, repeat to end of row. Evenly sl st down the side of the cape. Finish off and and weave in ends.
- Tip: Make sure to work the sl sts loosely so the edges will not pucker.

Finishing The Top Edge

Top Edge: With the right side of the cape towards you, use an I hook to attach matching yarn to the first st at the right edge of the collar. With an I hook, ch 1, sc in the same st, *ch 1, sc in the next st*, repeat in each st across the top edge. Finish off and weave in ends.



Attach yarn right below the "top edge" row. Surface crochet in each st across. This helps the collar stand better. I worked a few sts in purple yarn for the example photo so you could see this row better.



Ties (make 2)

With an H hook, attach matching yarn to the edge of the cape at the end of the ridge created by step #4. Ch 60. Finish off and tie a knot near the end of the chain. Weave in the beginning yarn tail.

Repeat for the opposite edge of the the cape.

Cross the ties and thread through the opposite edge of the cape, 1" below the starting point of the opposite tie.

Repeat for the second tie. Cross the ties and repeat once more. Cinch these together and tie a bow. See photo.

**Hat**

1. With an I hook and black yarn, start with a magic circle of 6 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (6sts)
2. 2sc in next st, sc 2*, repeat once. (8sts)
3. *2sc in next st, sc 3*, repeat once. (10sts)
4. Sc in each st to end of round.
5. *2sc in next st, sc 4*, repeat once. (12sts)
6. *2sc in next st, sc 5*, repeat once. (14sts)
7. *2sc in next st, sc 6*, repeat once. (16sts)
8. *2sc in next st, sc 7*, repeat once. (18sts)
9. *2sc in next st, sc 5*, repeat to end of round. (21sts)
10. *2sc in next st, sc 6*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)
11. Sc in each st to end of round.
12. *2sc in next st, sc 7*, repeat to end of round. (27sts)
13. *2sc in next st, sc 8*, repeat to end of round. (30sts)
14. Sl st in next st. This is the new beginning of the round. Change to orange yarn. Ch 1, Sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
- 15-16. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
17. Change to black yarn. Ch 1, *FPHDC around each of the next 4 posts, 2FPHDC around the next post*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36sts)
18. Ch 1, *sc 3, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (45sts)
19. Ch 1, *sc 4, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (54sts)
20. Loosely sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.



Buckle: With a yarn needle and a long piece of contrasting yarn (purple in sample), st a square shape around the hatband. See main photo for placement.

Chin Strap

Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an H hook and white ww yarn, attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat). Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.



Dress

This starts at the neck edge and is worked in rounds to the bottom edge.

Instructions are written for color changes/stripes as shown in the main sample above. Substitute colors as desired.

1. With an I hook and purple yarn, ch 40, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. Make sure the chain is not twisted. (40sts)
2. Ch 1, hdc in the same ch and in each ch around, sl st in the first st to join. (40sts)
3. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
4. Ch 1, *hdc 19, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (42sts)
5. Ch 1, *hdc 20, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (44sts)
6. Ch 1, *hdc 10, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (48sts)
7. Ch 1, *hdc 11, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (52sts)
8. Ch 1, *hdc 12, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (56sts)
9. Ch 1, *hdc 13, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)
10. Ch 1, *hdc 14, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (64sts)
11. Ch 1, *hdc 15, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (68sts)
12. Ch 1, *hdc 16, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (72sts)
13. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
14. Ch 1, *hdc 35, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (74sts)
15. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st around, sl st to join.
16. Ch 1, *hdc 36, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (76sts)
17. Finish off the current yarn and change to black yarn. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
18. Ch 1, *hdc 18, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (80sts)
19. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
20. Change to orange yarn. Note: Since I alternated between black and orange, I didn't cut the unused yarn when switching colors.
Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
21. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
22. Change to black yarn. Ch 1, *hdc 19, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (84sts)
23. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
24. Change to orange yarn. Ch 1, *hdc 20, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (88sts)
25. Ch 1, *hdc 21, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (92sts)
26. Change to black yarn. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
27. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
28. Change to orange yarn. Ch 1, *sc 22, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (96sts)
29. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.

Belt Loops - optional (make 4)

With an I hook and black yarn, ch 8, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Divide the middle band in fourths and place a marker (a piece of yarn, stitch marker, or pin).

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tails to sew the short ends to the dress on either edge of the wide middle stripe.



Snake Belt

This could be threaded through the belt loops or worn as a scarf.
The snake starts at the tip of the head.

1. With an H hook and yarn (color of choice), ch 2, 3sc in 2nd ch from hook. (3sts)
2. Ch 2, turn, 2hdc in same st, hdc 2. (4sts)
3. Repeat previous row until 7sts.
4. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 3, sc2tog. (5sts)
5. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog. (3sts)
6. This step is worked around the outer edge of the snake head. Sc 6 sts down the side of the snake head, (sc, ch 1, sc) in tip (beginning edge), sc 5 sts up the side of the head, 2sc in first st, sc 2. (4sts)
7. Ch 1, turn, sc in same st, sc 3. (4sts)
8. Repeat previous row for an additional 10 rows.
9. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 2. (3sts)
10. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc. (2sts)
11. Ch 1, turn, sc 2.
12. Repeat previous row until snake measures 26" from the beginning edge.
13. This step creates the coil/ringlet end of the snake. Ch 37, sc in 2nd ch from hook, 3sc in each of the next 9 chains, *sc in next ch, 3sc in next ch*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in snake body. Finish off and weave in ends.



Snake Tongue: Cut one piece of yarn, 3" long. Fold one in half and pull center loop through the tip of a snake head. Pull the ends through the loop until secure.

Non Halloween Belt

The following is based on a belt from previous snappy design. See photo on page 6.

Rainbow Belt (optional): With H hook and purple yarn (or color of choice), ch 110 snugly. Change to turquoise yarn. Sc in 2ndch from hook and in each ch across. Change to bright green yarn. Ch 1, turn, Sc in each st across. Change to yellow yarn. Ch 1, turn. Sc in each st across. Change to orange yarn. Ch 1, turn. Sc in each st across. Finish off and weave in all ends. Set aside.

Polka Dot Belt is made same as above, but with white yarn. Add polka dots made from colors of choice. Sample has 8 dots, 2 of 4 different colors. With H hook and yarn, make a magic circle of 6 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sts), join and pull closed. Finish off, leaving a tail for sewing to belt. Sew in place with yarn needle.

Flowers (optional): With H hook and white yarn, start with a magic circle of 10 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 10 sc sts), join and pull closed.

Ch 6, sl st in next st, ch 8, sl st in next st, repeat to end of round. Finish off, leaving a tail for sewing in place. Thread belt through loops, making sure to not pull too snug. Ends should overlap slightly. Place flower on top of overlapped ends, then place button on top. Use flower yarn tail and yarn needle to sew button in place, sewing through to inside of skirt.

Larger Flower: With H hook and white yarn, start with a magic circle of 5 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 5 sc sts), join and pull closed. 2sc in each st to end of round. (10st) 2sc in each st to end of round. (20 sts). Change to green, or color of choice. *Ch 6, sl st in next st, ch 8, sl st in next st*, repeat to end of round. Finish off, leaving a tail for sewing in place.

Add black swirl stitching with lightweight black yarn or black embroidery floss and a yarn needle.

Pumpkin Goose Set



Materials

- Yarn: 300 yards ww orange yarn, small amounts of brown and green. Yarn used in sample: Mainstays Orange, RHSS Spring Green, Cafe Latte
- Crochet Hook: H (5mm), I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors, 6-8 plastic bags for stuffing the pumpkin (optional)
- Gauge: 2" with an I hook = 7 hdc sts and 5 rounds

Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate the number of rows/rounds.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

Pumpkin Suit

This starts at the neck edge and is worked in rounds to the bottom edge.

1. With an I hook and orange ww yarn, ch 32, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. Make sure the chain is not twisted. (32sts)

2. Ch 1, sc in the same ch and in each ch around, sl st in the first st to join. (32sts) Slip this over the goose's head and make sure it isn't too small. It should be snug, but still able to slip over the head and down the neck. If it does not, start over, using a larger hook for the first 2 steps.

3. Ch 1, *hdc 3, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (40sts)

4. Ch 1, FPDC around the next post, hdc 2, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (50sts)

Tips: there should be 3 posts between the FPDC sts (for this round). Make sure to leave one st empty for the post st. You will work into the next st, not the one at the top of the post.

5. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 3, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)

6. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 4, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (70sts)

7. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (80sts)

8. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 6, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (90sts)

9. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 7, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (100sts)

10. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 8, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (110sts)

11. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 9, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (120sts)

12. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 10, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (130sts)

13. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 12*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join.

14. Repeat the previous round for an additional 9 rounds.

15. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 10, hdc2tog, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (120sts)

16. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 9, hdc2tog, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (110sts)

17. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 8, hdc2tog, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (100sts)

18. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 7, hdc2tog, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (90sts)

19. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 6, hdc2tog, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (80sts)

20. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 5, hdc2tog, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (70sts)

21. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 4, hdc2tog, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)

22. Ch 1, *FPDC around the next post, hdc 3, hdc2tog, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (50sts) Finish off and weave in ends.



Stuffing (optional)

The pumpkin suit is cute slipped on the goose as is. I wanted mine to be fuller so I used plastic grocery bags to fill mine out. I slipped the suit over the goose's head, but didn't stretch it down just yet. At this point, scrunch a grocery bag a little and insert it in the suit. See photo at right. Keep adding bags and fluff up the suit as needed. Pull the bottom edge down towards the feet.

Face (optional)

Eyes (make 2)

1. With an H hook and black yarn, ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (5sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 3. (4sts)
3. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 2. (3sts)
4. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc. (2sts)
5. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog. (1st) Finish off. leaving a long tail for sewing to the pumpkin.

Mouth: With an H hook and black yarn, ch 60, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next st, sc 2, hdc in each st until 4 sts remain, sc 2, sl st 2. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing to pumpkin.

Assembly: After pieces are complete, use a yarn needle and the yarn tails to sew each piece to the pumpkin.

Hat

1. With an I hook and brown (or green) ww yarn, start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method for creating a circle of 6 sc sts), pull closed and sl st in the first st to join. (6sts)
 2. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
 3. Work this round in BLO. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
 4. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (7sts)
 5. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (8sts)
 6. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc 3, 2sc in the next st, sc 3, sl st to join. (10sts)
 7. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc 4, 2sc in the next st, sc 4, sl st to join. (12sts)
 8. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc 3, *2sc in the next st, sc 3*, repeat once more, sl st to join. (15sts) Use your finger or end of crochet hook to push the top center of the stem down into the stem.
 9. Finish off the current yarn and change to orange yarn. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc 2, *2sc in the next st, sc 2*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (20sts)
 10. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc 3, *2sc in the next st, sc 3*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (25sts)
 11. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc 4, *2sc in the next st, sc 4*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (30sts)
 12. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
 13. Ch 1, 2hdc in the same st, hdc 5, *2hdc in the next st, hdc 5*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (35sts)
- Finish off and weave in ends.

Chin Strap

Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an I hook and ww yarn (white to match the goose), attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat). Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side. When ready, place the hat on the head and use the ties to tie a bow under the chin.



Leaf/Heart

1. With an I hook and green or brown ww yarn, ch 4, sl st in the last ch from hook to join in the round and form a loop. (4sts)
2. Ch 3, 5dc in the loop, ch 2, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook, 5dc in the loop, ch 3, sl st in the loop. Finish off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing to the hat.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the leaf/heart to the base of the stem.

Goose Holiday Suits

Materials

- Yarn: worsted weight in the following colors - 150 yards dark brown/red, 40 yards black, 50 yards off white/white, 10 yards gold
- Crochet Hook: H (5mm), I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors

Measurements

- Finished Measurements:
Suit - 9" from top to bottom, 14" across bottom edge
- Gauge - 4" with an I hook = 14 hdc sts and 9.5 hdc rounds

Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

Suit

This starts at the neck edge and is worked in rounds to the bottom edge. The collar is added after suit is complete.

Instructions are written for color changes as shown in the sample.

Substitute colors as desired.

Both the Santa and Pilgrim suits are made from the same pattern with changes noted as needed.

1. With an I hook and dark brown or red yarn, ch 44, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. Make sure the chain is not twisted. (44sts)

2. Ch 1, *hdc 10, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (48sts)

3. Ch 1, *hdc 11, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (52sts)

4. Ch 1, *hdc 12, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (56sts)

5. Ch 1, *hdc 13, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)

6. Ch 1, *hdc 14, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (64sts)

7. Ch 1, *hdc 15, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (68sts)

8. Ch 1, *hdc 16, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (72sts)

9. Ch 1, *hdc 17, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (76sts)

10-11. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

12. Ch 1, *hdc 18, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (80sts)

13. Ch 1, *hdc 39, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (82sts)

14. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

15. Finish off the current yarn and change to black yarn for the belt. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

16. Ch 1, *hdc 40, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (84sts)

17. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

18. Finish off the current yarn and change to brown yarn. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

19. Ch 1, *hdc 41, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (86sts)



20-21. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

For the Santa version, stop here and continue below.

22. *ch 1, sl st in next st*; repeat to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

Santa Version

1. Change to bulky weight white yarn (or one strand white worsted yarn + white novelty/fur yarn) and an I hook.
- 2-4 Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
5. Sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

I really wanted to add “fur” at the bottom and for the collar. I like using novelty “fur” yarns and hold one strand of ww yarn with the fur to make it easier to see the stitches.

Unfortunately, I didn't have enough fur yarn on hand so I used Red Heart Hygge yarn instead. I did want to show you how cute the fur looks too in case you have some. This is “boa” yarn which unfortunately is discontinued.



Pilgrim Collar

1. With the right side of the suit towards you, use an H hook and off white yarn to sl st in the FLO of any st on the top edge. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round. Do not join. (44sts)
2. Ch 1, turn. Work this step/row in FLO (the edge closest to you. Hdc in the same st, hdc 9, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 22, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 10. (46sts)
3. From this point on, the sts are worked between the posts of the previous row. This will prevent the ridges created when working back and forth in rows. To work “between” the sts, insert your hook between the next two posts from the previous row. This is right below the st you would normally place your hook. When the patterns states “in the stitch” the placement should still be as described above. It is written this way to make it easier to read the instructions.
- Ch 1, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 22, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5. (50sts)
4. Ch 1, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 26, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5. (54sts)
5. Ch 1, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 30, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5. (58sts)
6. Ch 1, turn, hdc between each of the posts to end of row.



7. Ch 1, turn, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 46, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5. (60sts)

Santa Collar

1. With the right side of the suit towards you, use an I hook and the same yarn used for the bottom edge of the suit to sl st in the FLO of any st on the top edge. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round. Do not join. (44sts)

2. Ch 1, turn. Work this step/row in FLO (the edge closest to you. Hdc in the same st, hdc 9, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 22, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 10. (46sts)

3. From this point on, the sts are worked between the posts of the previous row. This will prevent the ridges created when working back and forth in rows. To work “between” the sts, insert your hook between the next two posts from the previous row. This is right below the st you would normally place your hook. When the pattern states “in the stitch” the placement should still be as described above. It is written this way to make it easier to read the instructions.

Ch 1, turn, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 22, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5. (50sts)

4. Ch 1, turn, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 26, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st, hdc 5. (54sts)

5. Ch 1, turn, sc 5, 2sc in the next st, sc 5, 2sc in the next st, sc 30, 2sc in the next st, sc 5, 2sc in the next st, sc 5. (58sts)

6. *ch 1, sl st in next st*, repeat to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

Buckle

1. With an H hook and golden yellow yarn, ch 29, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (28sts)

2. Ch 1, turn, *sc 3, sc2tog, sc2tog*, repeat to end of row. (20sts) Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing in place.

Finger shape the buckle piece into a square, overlapping the short ends and centered over the belt section.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the buckle in place.



Top Hat

1. With an H hook and worsted weight black yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for creating a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and sl st in the first st to join. (8sts)

2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (16sts)

3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (24sts)

4. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (36sts)

5. Work this round in BLO and a little more snug than the previous rounds. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.

8. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.

9. Repeat the previous step for an additional 5 rounds.

10. Finish off the current yarn and change to brown yarn. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.

11. Repeat the previous step for an additional 3 rounds.

12. Finish off the current yarn and change back to black. Work this round in FLO. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.

13. Ch 1, *sc 5, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (42sts)

14. Ch 1, *sc 6, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (48sts)

15. Ch 1, *sc 7, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (54sts)

16. Ch 1, sc 4, *2sc in the next st, sc 8*, repeat until 5 sts remain, 2sc in the next st, sc 4, sl st to join. (60sts)
Finish off and weave in ends.

Ties: Fold the hat in half with the buckle in the middle to find the placement for the ties. With an H hook and ww yarn (white to match the duck), attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat). Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.

Buckle: Pull a long piece of golden yellow yarn through a yarn needle until the ends match up. Tie a knot.

- Stitch a square around the hatband to create the buckle with this double strand of yarn. Photo below, top left.
- After the square is complete, work on TOP of the hat (not up and down to the inside of the hat), slide the yarn needle under the next st. Photo below, top right.
- Pull the needle through until the yarn is snug. Repeat for each st working around the square. Photo below, bottom.



Santa Hat

1. With an I hook and red yarn (or desired color for the main hat section), start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (6sts)
2. Sc in each st to end of round.
3. Hdc in each st to end of round.
4. 2hdc in the next st, hdc in each st to end of round. (7sts)
5. Repeat the previous round until there are 16sts per round.
6. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 7*, repeat once. (18sts)
7. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 8*, repeat once. (20sts)
8. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 9*, repeat once. (22sts)
9. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 10*, repeat once. (24sts)
10. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 11*, repeat once. (26sts)
11. *2hdc in the next st, hdc 12*, repeat once. (28sts)
12. Sc in the next st, sl st in the next st. Finish off the current yarn and change to white yarn (or desired color for the hat band). This is the new start of the round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
13. Ch 1, *FPHDC around the next post from the previous round, BPHDC around the next post*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join.
- 14-15. Repeat the previous round.

Finish off and weave in ends.

Chin Strap

Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an I hook and ww yarn (white to match the goose), attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat). Scarf

This is made extra long and wrapped in a way that will stay put even in windy weather. To put the scarf on the goose find the center and make a loop at the front of the goose neck. Wrap both scarf ends around the back of the neck, to the front (below left) and down through the loop (below middle). Give the ends a tug until the scarf fits as desired. See photos below.



1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Red), ch 152, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (151sts) Stitch count will remain the same for the entire scarf.
2. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Finish off the current yarn and change color (Sample: Soft White). Ch 1, turn, hdc between the first two posts and between the posts to end of row. Note: "between the posts" is worked just below where a regular st would be placed.
4. Finish off the current yarn and change color (Sample: Green). Ch 1, turn, hdc between the first two posts and between the posts to end of row.
5. Finish off the current yarn and change color (Sample: Red). Ch 1, turn, hdc between the first two posts and between the posts to end of row.
6. Finish off the current yarn and change color (Sample: Soft White). Ch 1, turn, hdc between the first two posts and between the posts to end of row.
7. Finish off the current yarn and change color (Sample: Green). Ch 1, turn, hdc between the first two posts and between the posts to end of row.
8. Finish off the current yarn and change color (Sample: Red). Ch 1, turn, hdc between the first two posts and between the posts to end of row.
9. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row. Finish off and weave in ends.

Fringe: Cut 28 pieces of yarn, 8" long. Set 14 pieces aside for the opposite end of the scarf. The sample fringe matches the stripes.

Working with 2 strands at a time, pull the center loops through a spot at one end of the scarf. Pull the yarn tails through the loops until the loops are snug against the scarf. Repeat for the end of each stripe. Trim ends to desired length.

Repeat for the opposite end of the scarf.

Santa Hat

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Red), start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (6sts)

2. Sc in each st to end of round.

3. 2sc in the next st, sc in each st to end of round. (7sts)

4. Repeat the previous round, increasing 1 st per round, until there are 20 sts.

5. *2sc in the next st, sc 9*, repeat once. (22sts)

6. *2sc in the next st, sc 10*, repeat once. (24sts)

7. *2sc in the next st, sc 11*, repeat once. (26sts)

8. *2sc in the next st, sc 12*, repeat once. (28sts)

9. Sl st in the next st. This is the new start of the round. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. St count remains the same until noted in the pattern.

10. Finish off the current yarn and change to yarn for the hat brim (Sample: White). Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.

11. Ch 1, TURN to work from the inside of the hat. Sc in the same st, tr in the next st, *sc in the next st, tr in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.

12. Ch 1, tr in the same st, sc in the next st, *tr in the next st, sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.

13. This step starts one ear flap. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 5. (6sts) Leave remaining sts unworked.

14. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 2, sc2tog. (4sts)

15. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc2tog. (2sts)

16. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog. Finish off and weave in ends.

17. Skip 8 sts on the bottom edge of the hat. With an I hook and matching yarn, start in the next st. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc 5. (6sts)

18. Repeat steps 14-16.



Braids

Cut 18 pieces of yarn 12" long. Set 9 pieces aside for the second braid.

For the sample, there are 3 white and 6 red per braid.

Pull the yarn tails through the tip of one earflap until the ends are even. Divide the strands in thirds and braid. Use a matching piece of yarn to tie around the braid, near the bottom. Trim the ends of the braids as desired.

Beard

This starts at the bottom of the beard. Please refer to the steps on the last page of this pattern for working the loops. Don't let the loop stitch cause you stress. Take your time and remember the loops don't need to all be the same length.

Front Piece With Loops

Note: See the "loop stitch" tutorial at the end of the pattern for a more secure way to work this stitch. 2 loop sts will be worked into the sts on the even rows. To shape the beard, the following row will decrease those extra stitches. These two rows will be repeated throughout this step. Take your time and don't panic. It is worth it in the end. Just be patient.

The beard will slant to one side. This will be straightened when the two beard pieces are sewn together.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Soft White), ch 7, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (6sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, work 2 loop sts in each st to end of row. (12sts)
3. Ch 1, turn, hdc 2, *hdc2tog*, repeat until 2 sts remain, hdc 2. (8sts)
4. Ch 1, turn, work 2 loop sts in each st to end of row. (16sts)
5. Ch 1, turn, hdc 2, *hdc2tog*, repeat until 2 sts remain, hdc 2. (10sts)
6. Ch 1, turn, work 2 loop sts in each st to end of row. (20sts)
7. Ch 1, turn, hdc 2, *hdc2tog*, repeat until 2 sts remain, hdc 2. (12sts)
8. Ch 1, turn, work 1 loop st in each st to end of row. (12sts)
9. Ch 1, turn, hdc 2, sc 8, hdc 2.
10. Ch 1, turn, work 1 loop st in each st to end of row. (12sts)
11. Ch 2, turn, 2dc in the same st, hdc, sc 8, hdc, 2dc in the last st. (14sts) Finish off and weave in ends. Set aside.

Back Piece

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Soft White), ch 7, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (6sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, sc in each st until 1 st remains, 2sc in the last st. (8sts)
3. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, sc in each st until 1 st remains, 2sc in the last st. (10sts)



4. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, sc in each st until 1 st remains, 2sc in the last st. (12sts)
5. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
6. Repeat the previous row for an additional 4 rows.
7. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st, sc 10, hdc in the last st.
8. Ch 2, turn, 2dc in the same st, hdc, sc 8, hdc, 2dc in the last st. (14sts)
9. Place the front beard piece on top of this piece. The loopy side should be closest to you.
Ch 1. Working through both layers, sc evenly down the side of the beard. Work 2sc in the first st of the bottom row, sc 2, 2sc in the last st, sc evenly up the side of the beard. Sl st in the first st of the top row. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing the beard to the hat.

Beard Assembly

The top corners of the beard are sewn under the earflaps. Use a yarn needle and matching yarn to sew these layers together.

Hat Tail

Cut a piece of white yarn 10" long and set aside.

Wrap one strand of white yarn around the palm of your hand 15 times. Carefully slide off your hand. Wrap a piece of matching yarn around the center of the strands. Pull tight and tie a knot. Wrap around one more time, pull tight and tie another knot.

Hold the two tails from the beginning yarn piece. Trim loops of pom until desired size.

Use the yarn tails to sew the pompom to the tip of the hat.

If desired, the pompom tip of the hat can be sewn to the hat brim so it will stay at the front of the hat.

Chin Strap (optional)

If a beard will not be sewn in place, a chin strap can be added to tie the hat in place. This allows the braids to hang down on each side.

With an H hook and matching yarn, sl st into one earflap, right above the braid. Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot near the end of the chain.

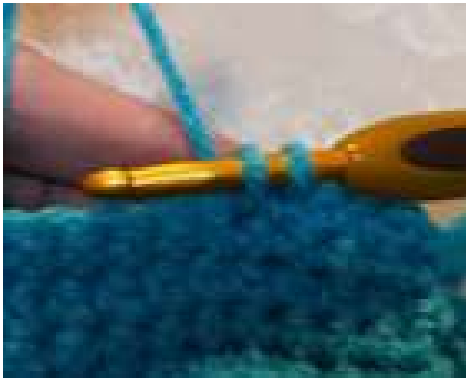
Repeat for the opposite side. When ready, place the hat on the head and use the ties to tie a bow under the chin OR the bow can be tied at one side and tucked up under the hat.



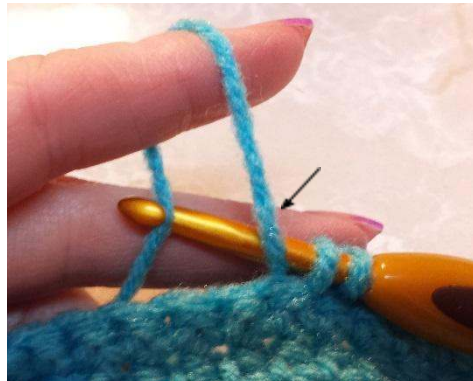
Tips For Working the Loop Stitch

Loop stitch: I prefer this more secure method for working the loop stitch.

- Take your time. It may seem a little awkward at first, but you will find your groove.
- Rotate hook as need to help get through loops.
- For this project its ok if loops are different lengths.
- Loops end up on back of piece. For this project the loop stitch will be worked with wrong side of piece towards you.



Insert hook in next st and pull up a loop.



Move working yarn in front of the hook. See arrow in photo.



Grab BOTH yarns and pull through first loop on hook. Go slow. This might seem a little tricky, especially if you crochet tight.



There should be 3 loops on the hook.



YO and pull through all loops on hook.



Loop stitch complete.

Snowman Goose Set

Description

When your goose wants to build a snowman, have him dress the part too.

Materials

- Yarn: 300-350 yards worsted weight
Yarns used in sample are all Red Heart Super Saver. If yardage is not listed, less than 50 yards was used.
 - Sweater and sleeves -200 yards Metallic White
 - Scarf - 70 yards Spring Green
 - Mittens -Turqua, Medium Purple, Spring Green
 - Hat - Black, Spring Green, Turqua, Medium Purple, White (chin strap)
 - Carrot Nose - Pumpkin, White (strap)
- Crochet Hooks: G (4.5mm), H (5mm), I (5.5mm)
- Notions: 3 Buttons (black, 1.25"), yarn needle for weaving in ends, measuring tape, scissors, sewing needle, black thread

Measurements

- Finished Measurements: Sweater - 11.5" long x 13" wide (at bottom) ; Hat - 3.25" tall x 4.25" across brim; Carrot Nose - 4" long x 3" wide
- Gauge: 4" with an I hook - 12 hdc sts, 12 rounds

Reminders

- FLO - front loop only is ALWAYS the loop facing you. When you turn the piece, the front loop designation does not follow. This applies to BLO as well
- Increases and regular sts:
2hdc in the next st = an increase. Work 2 hdc in the next st
hdc 2 = work one hdc in each of the next 2 sts. St count does not increase.

Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

Sweater

- This project starts at the neck and is worked in rounds.
- Color changes for the sample are noted throughout the pattern. Substitute colors as desired.
- Use yarns of similar weight when substituting yarns.

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn (Spring Green in sample), ch 42, sl st in the last st to join in a circle. (42sts)
2. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
3. Change yarn to a contrasting color (Turqua in sample). Do not cut the unused yarn. Carry it on the wrong side (inside of the piece). Ch 1, *hdc in FLO, hdc in BLO*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join.
4. Change yarn to the original color (Spring Green in sample). Do not cut the unused yarn. Carry it on the wrong side (inside of the piece). Ch 1, *hdc in BLO, hdc in FLO*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join.
5. Change yarn to a contrasting color (Turqua in sample). Ch 1, *hdc in FLO, hdc in BLO*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join.
6. Change yarn to the original color (Spring Green in sample). Ch 1, *hdc in BLO, hdc in FLO*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join.
7. Change yarn to a contrasting color (Turqua in sample). Ch 1, *hdc in FLO, hdc in BLO*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join.
8. Finish off both yarns and change to worsted weight yarn for the body of the sweater (Metallic White in the sample). Ch 1, *hdc 6, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (48sts)
9. Ch 1, *hdc 11, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (52sts)
10. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
11. Ch 1, *hdc 12, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (56sts)
12. Ch 1, *hdc 13, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)
13. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
14. Ch 1, *hdc 14, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (64sts)
15. Ch 1, *hdc 15, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (68sts)
16. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
17. Ch 1, *hdc 16, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (72sts)
18. Ch 1, *hdc 17, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (76sts)
19. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
20. Ch 1, *hdc 37, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat once, sl st to join. (78sts)
21. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
22. Repeat the previous round 12 more times.
23. Ch 1, *FPHDC 2, BPHDC 2*, repeat to end of round, (78sts) Finish off and weave in ends.
24. With an I hook and yarn to match the first/top round of the scarf section, loosely sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.



Arms and Mittens (make 2)

These start at the bottom/mitten. These are optional.

Finger shape the mitten when complete for a more rounded shape.

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn (Turqua in sample), start with a magic circle of 5 sc sts (or preferred method for creating a circle of 5 sc sts), pull closed and sl st in the first st to join. (5sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (10sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (15sts)
4. Ch 1, *sc 2, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (20sts)
5. Ch 1, *sc 4, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts)
6. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
7. Repeat the previous round for an additional 2 rounds.
8. Finish off the current yarn and change to a contrasting color (Medium Purple in sample). Ch 1, *hdc 7, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (27sts)
9. Ch 1, *FPHDC around the next post, BPHDC around the next post*, repeat until 1 st remains, FPHDC around the last post, sl st to join.
10. Ch 1, BPHDC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.
11. Work this round in the top of the sts from step 9 (in front of the previous round). Ch 1, sc 12, sc2tog, sc 11, sc2tog, sl st to join. (25sts)
12. Finish off the current yarn and change to the same yarn used in the body of the sweater (Metallic White in the sample). Attach to a stitch on the inside ridge from step 10. Ch 1, *hdc 7, hdc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts)
13. Ch 1, *hdc 10, hdc2tog*, repeat once, sl st to join. (22sts)
14. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
15. Ch 1, *hdc 9, hdc2tog*, repeat once, sl st to join. (20sts)
16. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
17. Ch 1, *hdc 8, hdc2tog*, repeat once, sl st to join. (18sts)
18. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
19. Repeat the previous round for an additional 6 rounds.

Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the top edge of the arm to the side of the sweater so the mitten end slants towards the belly.



See photo at right of the back of the sweater for help with placement.

Buttons (3)

With a sewing needle and black thread sew the three large buttons down the front of the sweater.

Optional: the “buttons” could be crocheted circles instead of buttons.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight Black yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for creating a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and sl st in the first st to join. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (16sts) Stop here or add one more round.
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (24sts)

Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tails to sew the “buttons” down the front of the sweater.

Scarf End

Use the same colors/sequence as the top, scarf section on the sweater. Color A = Spring Green; Color B = Turqua

1. With an I hook and color B, ch 61, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (60sts)
2. Finish off current yarn and change to color A. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Finish off current yarn and change to color B. Ch 1, *hdc in FLO, hdc in BLO*, repeat to end of row.
4. Finish off current yarn and change to color A. Ch 1, *hdc in BLO, hdc in FLO*, repeat to end of row.
5. Finish off current yarn and change to color B. Ch 1, *hdc in FLO, hdc in BLO*, repeat to end of row.
6. Finish off current yarn and change to color A. Ch 1, *hdc in BLO, hdc in FLO*, repeat to end of row.
7. Ch 1, turn, loosely sl st in each st to end of row. Finish off and weave in all ends.

Tassels: cut 28 pieces of yarn 8” long. Work with 2 strands of yarn at a time. Find the center loop of 2 strands and use a crochet hook to pull the center loops through one end of the scarf until the loops are snug against the scarf. Repeat across both ends. Optional: Pull the yarn ends apart for a frizzy look.

The scarf end can be tied in a loose knot (as shown in the sample) or folded in half. Use a yarn needle and matching yarn to sew the middle knot/fold to the side of the neck of the sweater.

Hearts

Small: mittens (make 1 or 2)

With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Spring Green in sample), ch 2. Work the following sts in the 2nd ch from the hook: dc, hdc, sc ch 2, sl st in the next ch from hook, ch 1, sc, hdc, dc, ch 2, sl st. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Pull the yarn tails to the back of the heart.

Tip: Everything goes into that same “2nd ch from hook”. The ch 2, sl st in second ch, ch 1 creates the point at the bottom.

Use a yarn needle and one yarn tail to weave through the base of the stitches to cinch the center closed if needed. Use remaining yarn to sew the heart to the mitten

Large: scarf (make 1)

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Medium Purple in sample), start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and sl st to join. (8sts)
2. (hdc, dc 2, hdc) in the next st, hdc 2, (hdc, ch 2, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook, hdc) in the next st, hdc 2, (hdc, dc 2, hdc) in the next st, sl st in the next sp (between posts) to join. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the heart to the scarf.



Top Hat

- This project starts at the top and is worked in rounds.
- Color changes for the sample are noted throughout the pattern. Substitute colors as desired.
- Use yarns of similar weight when substituting yarns.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Black in sample), start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for creating a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and sl st in the first st to join. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (16sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (24sts)
4. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (36sts)
5. Ch 1, *hdc 3, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (45sts) 3" across
6. Ch 1, BPHDC around each post from the previous round, sl st in the first st to join.
7. Ch 1, *sc 7, sc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (40sts)
8. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
9. Ch 1, *hdc 8, hdc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (36sts)
10. Ch 1, *hdc 10, hdc2tog*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (33sts)
11. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
12. Finish off the current yarn and change for first/top round of the hat band (Spring Green in sample). Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join.
13. Repeat the previous round for four additional rounds. Color sequence of sample: 2 rounds Turqua, 2 rounds medium purple.
14. Finish off the current yarn and change for hat band (Black in sample). Work this round in FLO. Ch 1, sc 5, *2sc in the next st, sc 3*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (40sts)
15. Ch 1, *sc 4, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (48sts)
16. Ch 1, sc 2, *2sc in the next st, sc 5*, repeat until 4 sts remain, 2sc in the next st, sc 3, sl st in the first st to join. (56sts)
17. Loosely sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

Tip: Finger shape the hat for a smooth, rounded brim and shape.

Chin Strap

Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (White in sample), attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat).

Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.

Place the hat on the goose' head. Tie the chin strap in a bow under the chin to hold the hat in place.

Carrot Nose

This project starts at the top of the beak and is worked in rounds towards the tip of the carrot.

1. With a G hook and worsted weight yarn (Pumpkin in sample), ch 26, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. (26sts)
2. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round. Place a marker for working in the round for the rest of the carrot (do not join).
3. *sc 11, sc2tog*, repeat once. (24sts)
4. Sc in each st to end of round.
5. *sc 10, sc2tog*, repeat once. (22sts)
6. Sc in each st to end of round.
7. *sc 9, sc2tog*, repeat once. (20sts)
8. Sc in each st to end of round.
9. *sc 8, sc2tog*, repeat once. (18sts)
10. Sc in each st to end of round.
11. *sc 7, sc2tog*, repeat once. (16sts)
12. *sc 6, sc2tog*, repeat once. (14sts)
13. Sc in each st to end of round.
14. *sc 5, sc2tog*, repeat once. (12sts)
15. Sc in each st to end of round.
16. *sc 4, sc2tog*, repeat once. (10sts)
17. Sc in each st to end of round.
18. *sc 3, sc2tog*, repeat once. (8sts)
19. *sc 2, sc2tog*, repeat once. (6sts) Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing the end closed.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to weave in and out of the remaining stitches. Pull to close and weave in yarn.

Strap

Fold the carrot in half to find the placement for the ties. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (White in sample), attach the yarn to one side. Ch 40. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.

Place the carrot over the goose' beak. Tie the strap behind the head to hold the carrot in place.
