



Mini Dress Up Goose

Materials

- Yarn: worsted weight. Samples were made from Red Heart Super Saver yarn in a variety of colors. Less than 50 yards per color.
 - Crochet Hooks: G (4.5mm), H (5mm)
 - Notions: Yarn needle for weaving in ends, 2 small black buttons per goose, black thread, sewing needle, stuffing
 - Optional: Measuring tape, scissors, approximately $\frac{1}{8}$ cup of stones or beads for weight, sock/nylon to hold beads
- Note: If this will be used with small children, substitute small safety eyes instead of buttons.

Measurements

- Finished Measurement of Goose: 7" tall x 3" wide x 4" deep
- Gauge: not needed for this project.

Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless worked in the round.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

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Goose Body

This starts at the bottom of the stuffie.

1. With a G hook and worsted weight yarn for the goose (RHSS Off White) start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for creating a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (8sts)
2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (16sts)
3. Sc 4, 2hdc in each of the next 4 sts, sc 4, 2hdc in each of the next 4 sts. (24sts)
4. *sc 6, hdc, 2hdc in each of the next 4 sts, hdc*, repeat once. (32sts)
5. Sc in each st to end of round.
6. Sc 8, 2sc in the next st, sc, 2sc in the next st, sc 14, 2sc in the next st, sc, 2sc in the next st, sc 4. (36sts)
7. *sc 8, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round. (40sts)
8. Sc in each st to end of round.
9. Repeat the previous round for an additional 6 rounds.
10. Sk 20 sts, sc in the next 20 sts. This will leave a large opening to create the tail. Stop here and add the weight (optional). Stuff firmly to this position. (20sts)
11. Sc2tog, sc 16, sc2tog. (18sts)
12. Sc in each st to end of round.
13. Sc2tog, sc 14, sc2tog. (16sts)
14. Sc in each st to end of round.
15. Sc2tog, sc 12, sc2tog. (14sts)
16. Sc in each st to end of round.
17. Repeat the previous round for an additional 3 rounds.
18. Sc 2, *2sc in the next st, sc*, repeat to end of round. (20sts)
19. Sc in each st to end of round.
20. Repeat the previous round for an additional 3 rounds.
21. The decreases should be centered across the back of the head. If your sts end up in a different area, please adjust placement as needed. Sc2tog, sc2tog, sc 14, sc2tog. (17sts) Stop here and add the face. Instructions on page 3.
22. Sc2tog, sc2tog, sc 11, sc2tog. (14sts) Add more stuffing to this point.
23. Sc 2, *sc2tog, sc*, repeat to end of round. (10sts) Finish off, leaving a long tail.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to weave in and out of the remaining sts. Pull to cinch closed Secure the yarn.



With a yarn needle, use a long piece of matching yarn to sew the tail closed (sts from step #10).

Wings (make 2)

1. With a G hook and yarn to match the body, start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (6sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to to end of round, sl st to join. (12sts)
3. Ch 1, sc in the same st, (hdc, dc) in the next st, ch 1, (dc, hdc) in the next st, sc 3, (sc, hdc) in the next st, 2hdc in the next st, (hdc, sc) in the next st, sc 3, sl st to join. (18sts)
4. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st, sc 2, (hdc, dc, hdc) in the ch 1 space, sc 3, 2sc in the next st, sc 3, 2sc in the next st, sc 3, 2sc in the next st, sc 2, sl st to join. (24sts) Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail from each wing to sew the wings to the body. I left the end tip and bottom edge unsewn.

Feet (make 2)

1. With an H hook and orange yarn, create a magic circle of 5 sc sts (or preferred method of creating a circle of 5 sc sts), pull closed and sl st to join. (5sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (10sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat once. Leave remaining sts unworked.
4. Ch 1, turn, (sc, hdc, ch 1, hdc) in the same st, sl st in the next st, (hdc, dc, h 1, hdc, sc) in the next st, sl st in the next st, (hdc, ch 1, hdc, sc) in the next st, sl st in each st around the foot (including unworked sts from previous step). Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing the feet to the body.

Place the two feet next to each other, not overlapping. With a yarn needle and matching yarn, sew the touching sides together. Use the remaining yarn to sew the middle of the feet to the bottom of the goose so the toes stick out in front.

Beak (make 2 pieces)

1. With an H hook and yellow yarn, ch 5, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (4sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 2. (3sts)
3. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc. (2sts)
4. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog. Finish off and weave in ends on the first beak. Leave a long tail on the second beak.

Place the two beak pieces on top of each other. With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the sides of the beak together. Use the remaining yarn to sew the beak to the base. Make sure the beak is low enough on the head section to leave room for the eyes and a hat.

Eyes: With a sewing needle and black thread, sew the buttons centered above the beak.



Hat

Bee, Ladybug: use black yarn; Frog: use green yarn

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, ch 21, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (20sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Ch 1, turn, sc7, sc2tog, sc 2, sc2tog, sc 7. (18sts)
4. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
5. Ch 1, turn, sc 6, sc2tog, sc 2, sc2tog, sc 6. (16sts)
6. Ch 1, turn, sc 4, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog, sc 4. (13sts)
7. Ch 1, turn, sc 6, sc2tog, sc 5. (12sts)
8. Ch 1, turn, sc 4, sc2tog, sc2tog, sc 4. Finish off, leave a long tail for sewing.

Fold the last row with right sides together. With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the sts of the final row together. Turn the hat right side out.

9. This step creates the ties at the bottom corners. With an H hook and matching yarn, ch 20, sl st in each st across the bottom edge of the hat, ch 20. Finish off. Tie a knot in each end.

Optional Edging (dark green on front of frog hat): With a yarn needle and contrasting yarn, wrap yarn around the beginning edge by inserting the needle in a st, pull through, and repeat.

Antennas for bee and ladybug: With an H hook and black yarn, ch 20, finish off and trim the ends. Pull one end through a st at the top, center of the hat until the antenna ends are even. Tie the antenna together on top of head to hold in place.

Frog eyes (make 2 of each)

With a G hook and white yarn, create a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of creating a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (6sts) Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

With a G hook and green yarn, create a magic circle of 10 sc sts (or preferred method of creating a circle of 10 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (10sts) Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

Place a white eye piece on top of a green eye piece. With a yarn needle, use the white yarn tail to sew it to the green back.

With a sewing needle and black thread, sew a small black button on top of the white piece.

With a yarn needle, use the green yarn tail to sew one edge of the green eye piece to the top of the hat. See main photo for placement.

Repeat for the second eye. Tip: I like to sew the edges of the eyes in the middle together to help the eyes stand up.

Sweater

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, ch 24, sl st in the last st to join. (24sts)
2. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
- 3-4. Ch 1, hdc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
5. Ch 1, *hdc 5, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (28sts)



6. Ch 1, 2hdc in the same st, hdc 2, 2hdc in the next st, *hdc 2, 2hdc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36sts)
7. *ch 4, sk 2, sl st in the next st*, repeat to end of round. Tip: sl st in the first loop of the round at the end. (12 loops)
- 8-9. *Ch 4, sl st in the next loop*, repeat to end of round.
- Finish off and weave in ends.

Flower

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (pink in sample), create a magic circle of 5 sc sts (or preferred method of creating a circle of 5 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (5sts)

2. Finish off the current yarn and change to white yarn. Ch 2, dc, ch 2, sl st in the same st, *(dc, ch 2, sl st) in the next st*, repeat to end of round. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the flower to the dresses.

Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

st	stitch

sc	single crochet
hdc	half double crochet
dc	double crochet
tr	treble/triple crochet
bp	back post
fp	front post
blo	back loop only
flo	front loop only
sc2tog	single crochet 2 sts together
hdc2tog	half double crochet 2 sts together
dc2tog	double crochet 2 sts together
*	repeat instructions
yo	yarn over
