



## Miss Patoola Berrymore

**Materials:**

Worsted weight yarn: tan, bright pink, light pink, lime green; DK weight white yarn

Hooks: F, G

Miscellaneous: safety eyes, yarn needle, embroidery needle (optional), embroidery thread or cotton crochet in bright pink (optional), approximately 1/2" Velcro for pocket, 18" of 1/2" wide ribbon, 1 yard of 1/8" pink ribbon (or your choice), stuffing, stitch markers

Note: Stitch count remains the same unless noted at the end of the line.

## Directions

### Head:

1. With G hook and tan yarn, start with a magic circle of 6 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), place marker for working in the round. (6sts)
2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (12sts)
3. \*sc, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (18sts)
4. \*sc 2, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)
5. \*sc 3, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (30sts)
6. \*sc 4, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (36sts)
7. \*sc 5, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (42sts)
8. \*sc 6, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (48sts)
9. \*sc 7, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (54sts)
- 10-20. Sc in each st to end of round.
21. \*sc 7, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (48sts)
22. \*sc 6, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (42sts)
23. \*sc 5, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (36sts)
24. \*sc 4, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (30sts)
25. \*sc 3, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)

If using safety eyes, put them in place now. Refer to picture for placement (I wait to embroider the nose until after ears are sew into place). Stuff head up to current row. You will add more stuffing but it is easier to get the majority of the stuffing in now. Stuff enough for a nice, solid, even, round shape but not too much that it shows through the stitches.

26. \*sc 2, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (18sts)
  27. \*sc, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (12sts)
  28. \*sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (6sts)
- Finish stuffing. Finish off and weave in loose ends.

### Ears (make 2):

1. With G hook and light pink yarn, start with a magic circle of 6 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), place marker for working in the round. (6sts)
  2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (12sts)
  3. \*sc, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (18sts)
  - 4-7. Sc in each st to end of round.
  8. \*sc, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (12sts)
- Finish off and leave a long tail for attaching to head.  
Make another ear.

Refer to pictures for placement. Pin ears in place if necessary. I use the rows as a guide to keep ears even. Using a yarn needle, attach ears to head (refer to end of pattern for extra help with this).

For nose, use yarn and a yarn needle (which is a little more difficult, but can be done if you do not have embroidery floss or crochet cotton), or an embroidery needle and floss or crochet cotton.

**Legs (make 2):**

1. With G hook and bright pink yarn, start with a magic circle of 6 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), place marker for working in the round. (6sts)
  2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (12sts)
  3. \*sc, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (18sts)
  - 4-7. Sc in each st to end of round.
  8. Work in BLO for this round. Change to tan yarn. Sc in each st to end of round.
  - 9-13. Sc in each st to end of round.
  14. Change to lime green yarn. \*sc 2, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)
  15. Sc in each st to end of round.
  16. \*sc 2, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (32sts)
  17. Sc in each st to end of round.
  18. \*sc 3, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (40sts)
  - 19-22. Sc in each st to end of round.
  23. \*sc 3, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (32sts)
  - 24-25. Sc in each st to end of round.
  - 26-27. \*sc 2, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)
  - 28-29. Sc in each st to end of round.
- Finish off and leave a long tail for attaching to body.

Ruffle on bloomers: Turn leg upside down and attach lime green yarn around a post on first green round to start the ruffle.

1. Sc around each post to end of round. (24sts)
  - 2-3. \*sc 2, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (32sts)
- Finish off and weave in ends. Stuff firmly.

Thread yarn needle with thinner ribbon and weave in and out of first row of brown (next to pink). Tie into a bow and cut off excess. Repeat on other leg.

**Arms:**

1. With G hook and tan yarn, start with a magic circle of 6 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), place marker for working in the round. (6sts)
2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (12sts)
3. \*sc, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (18sts)
- 4-18. Sc in each st to end of round.
- 19-21. Change to lime green yarn. Sc in each st to end of round.
22. \*sc, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (12sts)
23. Sc in each st to end of round. Finish off and leave a long tail for attaching to body. Stuff firmly.

Second Arm: Follow instructions above, except change to pink yarn for round #9 only. This creates the pink bracelet.

**Ruffles on Sleeve**

1. Attach green (matching) yarn to first round of sleeve on arm. Sc around each post. (18sts)
2. 2sc in ea st to end of round. (36sts)
3. \*sc 2, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (48sts)
4. Sc in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

## Body

1. With G hook and pink yarn, start with a magic circle of 6 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), place marker for working in the round. (6sts)
2. 2 sc in each st to end of round. (12sts)
3. \*sc, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (18sts)
4. \*sc 2, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)
5. \*sc 3, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (30sts)
6. \*sc 4, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (36sts)
7. \*sc 5, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (42sts)
8. \*sc 6, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (48sts)
9. \*sc 7, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (54sts)
10. Sc in each st to end of round.
11. \*sc 8, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (60sts)
12. Sc in each st to end of round.
13. This step creates the backpack opening. Ch 26, sk 26 sts, sc 34. (26 chs, 34 sts)
14. Sc 26 (these are worked into the "ch 26" from previous round), sc 34.
15. Sc in each st to end of round.
16. \*sc 9, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (66sts)
- 17-18. Sc in each st to end of round.
19. \*sc 10, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (72sts)
- 20-21. Sc in each st to end of round.
22. \*sc 11, 2 sc in next sc\*, repeat to end of round. (78sts)
- 23-24. Sc in each st to end of round.
25. \*sc 12, 2 sc in next sc\*, repeat to end of round. (84sts)
- 26-28. Sc in each st to end of round.
29. \*sc 12, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (78sts)
30. \*sc 11, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (72sts)
31. This step creates openings for the ribbon. Sl st in next st. Ch 3, tr in each st to end of round, sl st in top of ch 3.
32. Sc in each st to end of round. Do not join at the end of this round. Place marker and work in continuous rounds.
33. Change to lime green yarn. \*sc 10, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (66sts)
34. \*sc 9, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (60sts)
35. \*sc 8, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (54sts)
36. \*sc 7, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (48sts)
37. \*sc 6, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (42sts)
38. \*sc 5, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (36sts)
39. \*sc 4, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (30sts)
40. \*sc 3, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)
41. \*sc 2, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (18sts)
42. \*sc, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (12sts)
43. \* sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (6sts) Finish off and weave in ends.

### Optional: SECRET STASH VARIATION

The following instructions create a “secret stash” compartment INSTEAD of leaving it a backpack.

#### Pocket Insert:

1. With G hook and lime green yarn, ch 52. Sl st in last ch from hook to join in round. Make sure this ch is not twisted. (52sts)
  - 1-4. Sc in each st to end of round. (52sts)
  5. \*sc 2, sc2tog\*, repeat to end of round. (39sts)
  6. Sc in each st to end of round.
- Repeat until desired length. I kept placing the pocket insert inside the bear backpack area to see how long I wanted it. I chose to stuff most of my bear and only have a small pouch for mad money. My insert has ten rows total.

Finish off, leaving a long tail, at least 12”.  
Fold insert in half and whip stitch bottom edge together.

Stuff body firmly, leaving room for insert.  
Place insert into body. Pin insert into backpack opening. With yarn needle and yarn tail, sew top edge of insert to backpack opening.



#### Backpack Flap

1. This step is worked only across the top edge of the backpack opening. With H hook, attach pink yarn at corner of backpack opening and sc in each st across top of opening, sl st into last st. (approximately 30sts)
2. Ch 2, turn, dc in each st to end of row.
- 3-6. Ch 2, turn, dc in each st to end of row.
7. Ch 1, turn, sc in each st to end of row. Finish off and weave in ends.

#### Skirt

Turn bear upside down

1. Working in row 34 of body (where colors change), sc 66. (66sts)
  2. \*2sc in ea st\*, repeat to end of round. (132sts)
  3. \*sc 2, 2sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (176sts)
- Repeat round 3 until desired length (I have six rounds total).

#### ASSEMBLY

Using the tails left over (or reattaching yarn if necessary) attach parts in this order:  
Flatten arms and whipstitch to top of body, making sure they are secure.

Attach head to body. Take a deep breath...this can be a little tricky. Pin in place if necessary and don't worry about proper stitch etiquette. Just attach it so it doesn't pop off!

Attach legs to body. They can be flattened first and attached (easier) or left round and attached. Thread wider ribbon over three tc and under two, completely around, then tie a bow. I put a small dab of fray check on the cut ends of the ribbon to keep from fraying.

## Accessories

### Headband

Cut two pieces of yarn (one green, one pink) 18" long and braid. Wrap around head, in front of ears (refer to pictures for placement) and tie in a know under where flower is by ear. Cut off excess and weave ends into head. Using a sewing needle and matching thread, stitch headband to head.

### Flower

1. With F hook and lime green yarn, ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Join with sl st to first sc.  
2. Change to pink yarn, [ (ch 2, 3dc, ch 2, sl st) in the same sc, sl st to the next sc], 5 times, making 5 petals. Finish off, leaving a yarn tail for attaching to head.

With yarn needle and yarn tail, sew flower in front of ear (cover headband joining)

### Polka Dots

(make 14)

1. With F hook and white yarn, start with a magic circle of 6 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), place marker for working in the round. (6sts)  
2. 2 sc in each st to end of round. (12sts)  
3. \*sc, 2 sc in next st\*, repeat to end of round. (18sts) Finish off, leaving a tail for sewing in place.

With yarn needle and yarn tail, stitch polka dots to body (refer to pictures for placement).

### Backpack straps

There are several options for straps: ribbon, cord, rope, etc. I have included instructions to make cord using the supplies in the pattern list.

Choose two colors from the bear (I used green and pink). Holding four strands (2 of each color) in each hand, braid until the desired length. Mine is approximately 48" and fits a toddler.

To attach the cord, weave each end into the body just above each leg, towards the outer edge, then tie a secure knot. Find the center of the cord and sew to center back where body meets the head.

Find the center of the backpack opening and attach one half of Velcro to each side securely. I use a regular sewing machine because the Velcro is hard to hand stitch through.

| Common Crochet Abbreviations |                                                              |
|------------------------------|--------------------------------------------------------------|
| Ch – chain                   | Sc2tog – decrease, single crochet 2 sts together             |
| St - stitch                  | Dc2tog – decrease, double crochet 2 sts together             |
| Sp – space; sps - spaces     | Fp – front post                                              |
| Sc – single crochet          | Bp – back post                                               |
| Hdc – half double crochet    | Fpdc – front post double crochet                             |
| Dc – double crochet          | Bpdc – back post double crochet                              |
| Beg - beginning              | BLO – back loop only                                         |
| Sl st – slip stitch          | FLO – front loop only                                        |
| Yo – yarn over               | ** - repeat instructions between, as many times as indicated |
