



Description

These bags are designed for a 23" plastic goose or similar.

Materials

- Yarn: worsted weight. Less than 40 yards per bag
- Crochet Hook: H (5mm)
- Notions: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors, 1" button (backpack closure)

Measurements

- Backpack 7" x 4.5"; Fanny Pack 6.5" x 4"; Shopping Bag 5" x 4"

Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless worked in the round.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

Backpack



This was designed to be worn with one of the outfits that has arms. The two straps hang on the shoulders. This is worked back and forth in rows that will be vertical when bag is complete.

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn, ch 21, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (20sts)
- 2-8. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
9. Ch 1, turn, BPHDC around each post to end of row.
10. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
11. Ch 1, turn, BPHDC around each post to end of row.
12. Repeat steps 2-11.
13. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Line up the beginning and ending rows. Use a yarn needle and the yarn tail to sew the edges together.
14. Sewing the bottom: The post st rows with the hdc row between them create a small gusset at the sides. Pinch the edges of the bag together at the sides and pin to hold if needed. With a yarn needle and matching yarn, sew the bottom layers of the bag together.
15. With the same hook and yarn, start in the top, right corner of the front of the bag. Ch 1, sc 32 sts evenly spaced around the top opening of the bag, sl st to join. (32sts)



16. This step starts the flap. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st, hdc 14. Leave remaining sts unworked. (15sts)

17-18. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st, hdc 14.

19. Ch 1, turn, hdc2tog, hdc 11, hdc2tog. (13sts)

20. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of row.

21. Ch 1, turn, hdc2tog, hdc 9, hdc2tog. (11sts)

22. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, hdc 7, sc2tog. (9sts)

23. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, hdc 5, sc2tog. (7sts) Finish off and weave in ends.

24. This step is worked across the outer edge of the flap and creates the button loop. If no button is desired work one sc in place of the underlined section.

With the same hook and yarn, start in the bottom right corner of the flap. Ch 1, sc evenly up the side of the flap, sc 3, (sl st, ch 7, sl st) in the next st, sc 3, sc evenly down the side of the flap. Finish off and weave in ends.

Straps: With the same yarn and hook, start in the top corner on the back of the bag. Attach yarn and ch 50, sl st in the bottom corner of the same edge. Ch 1, turn, sc in each ch across, sl st in the same st on the bag. Finish off and weave in ends.

Button Closure (optional): Fold the flap down to find placement for the button. With a sewing needle and matching thread, sew the button in place.

Slip the chain loop over the button.



Fanny Pack

This simple little bag is the perfect size for fitting the little necessities for shopping or going on walks. It can be worn around the waste or over the shoulder.

Strap

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn, ch 101, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (100sts)

2. Ch 1, turn, dc in the same st, dc 24, hdc in each st to end of row.

3. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row. Finish off and weave in ends. Set aside.

Bag

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn, ch 21, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (20sts)

2-3. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of row.

4. Ch 1, turn, hdc2tog, hdc 16, hdc2tog. (18sts)

5. Ch 1, turn, hdc2tog, hdc 14, hdc2tog. (16sts)

6. Ch 1, turn, hdc2tog, hdc 12, hdc2tog. (14sts)

7. Ch 1, turn, hdc2tog, hdc 10, hdc2tog. (12sts)

8. Work this row in BLO. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc in the same st, hdc 10, 2hdc in the last st. (14sts)

9. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc in the same st, hdc 12, 2hdc in the last st. (16sts)

10. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc in the same st, hdc 14, 2hdc in the last st. (18sts)

11. Ch 1, turn, 2hdc in the same st, hdc 16, 2hdc in the last st. (20sts)

12-13. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of row.

14. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.

15. Fold the bag in half with wrong sides together. Ch 1. Working through both layers, sc evenly down the side, (sc, ch 1, sc) in the first st at the bottom, sc in each st until 1 st remains, (sc, ch 1, sc) in the last st, sc evenly up the side of the bag. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing to the strap.

Place the bag on the middle of the strap. Line up the top edge of the bag with the far edge of the strap (the strap sits under the bag). With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the bag to the strap.

Button: The button will slip through the dc sts where needed. Decide if you want the button to slip through the strap to the outside (shown in the sample) or down through the strap so it won't be seen. This determines which side (top or bottom) of the strap you need to sew the button. Use a yarn sewing and matching thread to sew the button to the opposite end of the strap.



Shopping Bag

This starts at the bottom of the bag.

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn, ch 19, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (18sts)
- 2-3. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
4. This step is worked around the outer edge of the rectangle. Ch 1, turn, 3sc in the same st, sc 16, 3sc in the last st, sc in the side of the rectangle, 3sc in the first st of the bottom row, sc 16, 3sc in the last st, sc in the side of the rectangle, sl st st to join (46sts)
5. Ch 1, BPSC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.
- 6-7. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
8. Ch 1, sc 2, *sc2tog, sc 9*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (42sts)
9. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
10. Keep repeating the previous round until bag is 5" from the bottom ridge (step 5) or desired height.
11. Sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

Handle: Flatten the bag, centered with the bottom rectangle.

Find the middle stitch of the top edge and join matching yarn to this stitch with an H hook and matching yarn.

Ch 38, sl st in the middle st of the top edge directly across from the first handle st. Ch 1, turn, sl st in each ch across, sl st in the same st on the bag. Finish off and weave in ends.

ch	chain
sl	slip
st	stitch
sp	space
sc	single crochet
hdc	half double crochet
dc	double crochet
tr	treble/triple crochet
bp	back post
fp	front post
blo	back loop only
flo	front loop only
sc2tog	single crochet 2 sts together
hdc2tog	half double crochet 2 sts together
dc2tog	double crochet 2 sts together
*	repeat instructions
yo	yarn over
