





For these wigs, I decided to make them as a separate piece instead of crocheting them to the hat. This way they are interchangeable, plus the hats can be with or without hair.

The hats are designed with an inner ridge to attach yarn if desired. It is a great way to add braids too.

## Hats for 28" Goose

### Materials

- Yarn: worsted weight in small amounts)
- Crochet Hooks: H (5mm), (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors

### Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

## 28" Goose Sunhat

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for creating a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and sl st in the first st to join. (8sts)

2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (16sts)

3. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (20sts)

4. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (25sts)

5. Ch 1, \*sc 4, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (30sts)



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6-8. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

9. Ch 1, \*FPHDC around each of the next 4 posts, 2FPHDC around the next post\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36sts)

10. Ch 1, \*sc 2, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (48sts)

11. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)

12. Ch 1, sc 2, 2sc in the next st, \*sc 4, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat until 2 sts remain, sc 2, sl st to join. (72sts)

13. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.

### Chin Strap

Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn, attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat).

Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.

## 28" Goose Bucket Hat

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (8sts)

2. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (16sts)

3. Ch 1, \*sc, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts)

4. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (30sts)

5. Ch 1, \*sc 2, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (40sts)

6. Ch 1, BPHDC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.

7-9. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

10. Ch 1, FPSC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.

Tip: Hold the base of the st to prevent the yarn from stretching when working sts in one loop only.

11. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (50sts)

12. Ch 1, \*sc 4, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)

13. Ch 1, \*sc 5, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (70sts)

14. Sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends. Finger shape the outer edge to smooth.

### Chin Strap

Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn, attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat).

Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.



## 28" Goose Wig

This starts with a small rectangle for the middle. There are three ringlets on each side.

1. With an I hook and worsted weight yarn, ch 8, sc in the 2nd ch from hook, hdc 5, sc. (7sts)

2. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, hdc 5, 2sc. (9sts)

3. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, hdc 7, 2sc in the last st. (11sts)

4. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, hdc 9, sc.

5. Repeat the previous row 2 more times.

6. This step creates the loops. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, ch 50, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hair piece. First ringlet complete.

Sl st in the next st on the hairpiece. Ch 60, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hair piece. Second ringlet complete.

Sl st in the next st on the hairpiece. Ch 50, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hairpiece. Third loop complete.

Sc2tog. This step is worked across the edge of the hairpiece to create "bangs". Ch 5, sl st in the corner of the piece, \*ch 5, sl st in the next space\*, repeat, evenly spacing the sl sts to create a total of 7 loops across this edge.

This step is worked across the beginning edge of the hairpiece. Ch 1, sc2tog, ch 50, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hair piece. First ringlet on this side complete.

Sl st in the next st on the hairpiece. Ch 60, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hair piece. Second ringlet on this side complete.

Sl st in th next st on the hairpiece. Ch 50, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hair piece. Third ringlet on this side complete.

Sc2tog. Finish off and weave in ends.

For longer, less curly ringlets, hold on to each end of a ringlet and gently tug to stretch the sts just a bit.



## Hats for 23" Goose

### Materials

- Yarn: worsted weight in small amounts)
- Crochet Hooks: H (5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors

### Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

## 23" Goose Sunhat

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for creating a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and sl st in the first st to join. (8sts)

2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (16sts)

3. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (20sts)

4. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (25sts)

5. Ch 1, \*sc 4, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (30sts)

6-8. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

9. Ch 1, \*FPHDC around each of the next 4 posts, 2FPHDC around the next post\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36sts)

10. Ch 1, \*sc 2, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (48sts)

11. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)

12. Ch 1, sc 2, 2sc in the next st, \*sc 4, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat until 2 sts remain, sc 2, sl st to join. (72sts)

13. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. Finish off and weave in ends.

### Chin Strap

Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat).

Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.



## 23" Goose Bucket Hat

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (16sts)
3. Ch 1, \*sc, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts)
4. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (30sts)
5. Ch 1, \*sc 2, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (40sts)
6. Ch 1, BPHDC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.
- 7-8. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
9. Ch 1, FPSC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.  
Tip: Hold the base of the st to prevent the yarn from stretching when working sts in one loop only.
10. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (50sts)
11. Ch 1, \*sc 4, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts)
12. Sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends. Finger shape the outer edge to smooth.

### Chin Strap

Fold the hat in half to find the placement for the ties. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, attach the yarn to an inside loop (so it doesn't show on the outside of the hat).

Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.

## 23" Goose Wig

This starts with a small rectangle for the middle. There are three ringlets on each side.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, ch 8, sc in the 2nd ch from hook, hdc 5, sc. (7sts)
  2. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, hdc 5, 2sc. (9sts)
  3. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, hdc 7, 2sc in the last st. (11sts)
  4. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, hdc 9, sc.
  5. Repeat the previous row 2 more times.
  6. This step creates the loops. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, ch 50, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hair piece. First ringlet complete.
- Sl st in the next st on the hairpiece. Ch 60, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hair piece. Second ringlet complete.



Sl st in the next st on the hairpiece. Ch 50, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hairpiece. Third loop complete.

Sc2tog. This step is worked across the edge of the hairpiece to create “bangs”. Ch 5, sl st in the corner of the piece, \*ch 5, sl st in the next space\*, repeat, evenly spacing the sl sts to create a total of 7 loops across this edge.

This step is worked across the beginning edge of the hairpiece. Ch 1, sc2tog, ch 50, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hair piece. First ringlet on this side complete.

Sl st in the next st on the hairpiece. Ch 60, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hair piece. Second ringlet on this side complete.

Sl st in th next st on the hairpiece. Ch 50, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the same st on the main hair piece. Third ringlet on this side complete.

Sc2tog. Finish off and weave in ends.

For longer, less curly ringlets, hold on to each end of a ringlet and gently tug to stretch the sts just a bit.

## Hats for 17”/19” Goose

### Materials

- Yarn: worsted weight in small amounts)
- Crochet Hooks: H (5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors

### Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

## 17”/19” Goose Sunhat

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic loop of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (8sts)

2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (16sts)

3. \*sc, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round. (24sts)

4. Sc in each st to end of round.

5-6. Hdc in each st to end of round.

7. Sl st in the next st. This is the new beginning of the round. Each round will be joined from this point on. Ch 1, \*FPHDC 3, 2FPHDC around the next post\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (30sts)

8. Ch 1, \*hdc, 2hdc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (45sts)



9. Ch 1, \*hdc 2, 2hdc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (60sts) Finish off and weave in ends.

Chin straps: with an H hook and matching yarn, sl st in a st (from the ridge created by step 6) on the inside of the hat. Ch 30. Finish off and tie a small knot in the end. Repeat for the second strap, directly across from the first one.

## 17"/19" Goose Bucket Hat

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and sl st to join. (8sts)

2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (16sts)

3. Ch 1, hdc in the same st, 2hdc in the next st, \*hdc, 2hdc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts)

4. Ch 1, FPSC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.

5. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.

6. Ch 1, FPSC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.

7. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (30sts)

8. Ch 1, \*sc 2, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (40sts) Finish off and weave in ends.

Chin straps: with an H hook and matching yarn, sl st in a st (from the ridge created by step 6) on the inside of the hat. Ch 30. Finish off and tie a small knot in the end. Repeat for the second strap, directly across from the first one.

## 17"/19" Goose Wig

This starts with a small rectangle for the middle. There are three ringlets on each side.

1. With an h hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Yellow), [ch 30, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain], repeat from [ to ].

2. Sl st in the top of the first ringlet to pull the two together. Ch 1, 2sc in the same st.

3. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, 2sc in the next st. (4sts)

4. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, sc 2, 2sc in the last st. (6sts)

5. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st across.

6. Repeat the previous row for an additional 4 rows.

7. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 2, sc2tog. (4sts)

8. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc2tog. (2sts)

9. [Ch 30, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the hair piece], repeat from [ to ].

The wig can be complete at this time or more ringlets can be added across the back.



10. Working across the back long edge of the hair piece, divide the edge into 4. Sl st in the first spot. [Ch 30, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, \*sk 1, 3sc in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st in the hair piece], repeat from [ to ] in each of the next 3 spots. Finish off and weave in ends.

**Chin Ties:** With the same size hook and worsted weight yarn to match the goose (Sample: White), sl st into a st on the inside of the flat middle piece, behind one ringlet. Ch 30. Finish off and tie a knot in the end of the chain. Repeat for the opposite side.

## Hats for 7" Crocheted Goose

### Materials

- Yarn: worsted weight in small amounts)
- Crochet Hooks: G (4.25-4.5mm), H (5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors

### Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

## 7" Goose Sunhat

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic loop of 6 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (6sts)

2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (12sts)

3. \*sc, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round. (18sts)

4. Sc in each st to end of round.

5. Sl st in the next st. This is the new beginning of the round. Each round will be joined from this point on. Ch 1, hdc in the same st, hdc in the next st, 2hdc in the next st, \*hdc 2, 2hdc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts)

6. Ch 1, FPSC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.

7. Ch 1, \*hdc, 2hdc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36sts)

8. Ch 1, \*hdc, 2hdc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (54sts)

9. Sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

Chin straps: with an H hook and matching yarn, sl st in a st (from the ridge created by step 6) on the inside of the hat. Ch 30. Finish off and tie a small knot in the end. Repeat for the second strap, directly across from the first one.



## 7" Goose Bucket Hat

1. With a G hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull closed and sl st to join. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (16sts)
3. Ch 1, sc in the same st, 2sc in the next st, \*sc, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts)
4. Ch 1, FPSC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.
5. Ch 1, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
6. Ch 1, FPSC around each post to end of round, sl st to join.
7. Ch 1, \*sc 3, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (30sts)
8. Ch 1, \*sc 2, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (40sts) Finish off and weave in ends.

Chin straps: with an H hook and matching yarn, sl st in a st (from the ridge created by step 6) on the inside of the hat. Ch 30. Finish off and tie a small knot in the end. Repeat for the second strap, directly across from the first one.

## 7" Goose Wig

This starts by creating one set of ringlets. There are two ringlets on each side.

This starts at the front and is worked back and forth in rows to the back of the wig.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, ch 18, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (17sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Ch 1, turn, sc 6, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog, sc 6. (15sts)
4. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
5. Ch 1, turn, sc 2, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog, sc, sc2tog, sc 2. (11sts)
6. Ch 1, turn, \*sc2tog, sc\*, repeat until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (8sts) Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing the back.

Fold the last row with right sides together. With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the sts of the final row together. Turn the wig right side out.

### Ringlets (make 2)

Attach the ringlets to the bottom, front corners of the wig.

With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, sl st into a spot on the wig. Ch 25, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, sl st in the next ch, \*3sc in the next ch, sl st in the next ch\*, repeat to end of chain, sl st into the wig next to the first spot. Finish off and weave in ends. Repeat for the second ringlet.



## Hats for Mini 7” Plastic Goose

These have a tiny head so there isn't much room for hat.

### Materials

- Yarn: worsted weight in small amounts)
- Crochet Hooks: H (5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors

### Tips

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

## Mini 7” Goose Sunhat

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic loop of 5 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 5 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (5sts)
2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (10sts)
3. \*sc, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round. (15sts)
4. Sc in FLO of each st to end of round.
5. Sc, \*2sc in the next st, sc\*, repeat to end of round. (22sts)
6. 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st in the next st. Finish off and weave in ends.

Chin Strap: with an H hook and matching yarn, sl st in a st (from the ridge created by step 4) on the inside of the hat. Ch 6, sl st in a st directly across the hat. Finish off and weave in ends.

## Mini 7” Goose Bucket Hat

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn, start with a magic loop of 5 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 5 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (5sts)
2. 2sc in each st to end of round. (10sts)
3. \*sc, 2sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round. (15sts)
4. Sc in FLO of each st to end of round.
5. Sc, \*2sc in the next st, sc\*, repeat to end of round. (22sts)
6. Sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends.

Chin Strap: with an H hook and matching yarn, sl st in a st (from the ridge created by step 4) on the inside of the hat. Ch 6, sl st in a st directly across the hat. Finish off and weave in ends.
