

Camp Snappy Badges 2026



This is a special pattern pack for our very first “Camp Snappy”, a virtual summer camp in June, 2026.

Materials and Details

- Yarn: Red Heart Super Saver, a worsted weight yarn
- Yardage: Sash - 100 yards; Badges - small amounts
- Crochet Hooks: G (4-4.5mm), H (5mm), I (5.5mm)
- Supplies: Yarn needle for weaving in ends
- Optional: Measuring tape, scissors, button to hang the granny square, sewing needle, thread, 2 tiny black buttons for frog eyes.
- Gauge: not needed for these projects

Tips for all items and sizes

- The first stitch of each round is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and not indicate the number of rows/rounds.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of row/round.

- How to surface crochet: Think of this as sl sts. Starting with the hook and yarn on top of the piece, *insert hook through a hole in the piece and pull up a loop, pull through the loop on your hook*, repeat, starting in the next hole in the piece. [Video](#)

Included In This Pattern

- Badges
- Goose Sash for 17", 19", 23", 28" geese and also fits the “Granny Helper” pattern to create a “Snappy Camper”.



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Goose Sash

- This is designed for a 23"/28" porch goose, with suggestions for custom sizing.
- 23" use an H hook, 28" use an I hook
- Custom sizing: Adjust the length by starting with more or fewer chains.
- This is worked back and forth in long rows. When complete, one short end is sewn against the corner edge of the other end.

1. With hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: White), ch 86, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (85sts)

2. Ch 1, turn, sc in each st to end of row.

3. Repeat the previous step for an additional 9 rows.

4. Ch 1, turn, sl st in the BLO of each st to end of row. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing sash in a circle when complete.

Trim (optional)

I chose to add orange stripes near the outer edges to match the cabin my goose chose for camp (orange).

With the same hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Pumpkin), start at one end. Using the line created by the stitching, surface crochet across the length of the sash. Finish off, using a yarn needle to sew each yarn tail to the back of the sash.

Repeat for the opposite long edge of the sash.

Assembly: Fold the ends together as shown in the photo below. Use a yarn needle and the yarn tail to sew one short end to the side of the other end.

I did add a button for the granny square badge to hang on. This is optional. I suggest waiting until your badges are complete to decide if you would like that option and placement.



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Small Goose Sash

- This is designed for a 17"/19" porch goose
- This is worked back and forth in long rows. When complete, one short end is sewn against the corner edge of the other end.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Aran), ch 70, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (69sts)

2. Ch 1, turn, sc in each st to end of row.

3. Repeat the previous step for an additional 4 rows (6 rows total)

4. Ch 1, turn, sl st in the BLO of each st to end of row. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing sash in a circle when complete.

Trim and Assembly: Follow the instructions from the larger sash on page 3.

Badges: I used an F hook and followed the instructions for the smile patch. It ended up just the right size. I suggest trying this for the rest of the badges.



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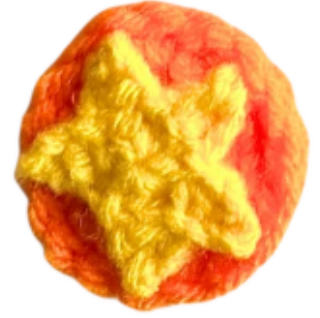
The Badges

These could be sewn to the sash, a pillow, flag, bag, or similar.

Star Badge

Star

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Bright Yellow), start with a magic circle of 5 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 5 sc sts), pull closed and sl st to join. (5sts)
2. *Ch 3, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook, hdc, sl st in the next st on the circle*, repeat to end of round. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place. Set aside.



Background

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Pumpkin), start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (6sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (12sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (18sts)
4. Sl st in each st to end of round. Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail for wrapping the outer edge and sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to wrap the yarn around the outer edge. This is done by inserting the needle in the next st from back to front (or vice versa) and repeated in each st to end of round. The remaining yarn tail will be used to sew the background to the desired project.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail from the star to sew it to the background. Set badge aside.

Frog Badge

Frog

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Spring Green), start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (6sts)
2. Ch 1, (hdc, dc, hdc) in the same st, 2sc in each of the next 2 sts, (hdc, dc, hdc) in the next st, 2sc in each of the next 2 sts, sl st to join. (14sts)
3. This step creates the background for the eyes. Ch 1, turn, work this step in BLO. Hdc in the same st, (hdc, ch 1, sl st) in the BLO of the next st, (sl st, ch 1, hdc) in the BLO of the next st, (hdc, ch 1, sl st) in the next st. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.



Eyes: With a yarn needle, use a long piece of white yarn to take several sts to create the white area on each eye. With a sewing needle and black thread, sew a small button on top of each white section.

Mouth: With a yarn needle and black yarn, stitch a smile.



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Background

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Turqua), start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (6sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (12sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (18sts)
4. Ch 1, *sc 2, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts) Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail for wrapping the outer edge and sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to wrap the yarn around the outer edge. This is done by inserting the needle in the next st from back to front (or vice versa) and repeated in each st to end of round. The remaining yarn tail will be used to sew the background to the desired project. Set aside.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail from the frog to sew it to the background. Set badge aside.

Heart Badge**Heart**

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Cherry), start with a magic circle of 8 sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 8 sc sts), sl st to join. (8sts)
2. (sc, hdc, dc 2, hdc) in the same st, hdc 2, (hdc, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, hdc) in next st, hdc 2, (hdc, dc 2, hdc, sc) in next st, sl st in next st. Finish off, leaving a tail for sewing in place. Set aside.

**Background**

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Buff), start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (6sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (12sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (18sts)
4. Ch 1, *sc 2, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts) Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail for wrapping the outer edge and sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to wrap the yarn around the outer edge. This is done by inserting the needle in the next st from back to front (or vice versa) and repeated in each st to end of round. The remaining yarn tail will be used to sew the background to the desired project. Set aside.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail from the heart to sew it to the background. Set badge aside.



Yarn Ball Badge

This starts in the middle with the yarn ball.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Shocking Pink), start with a magic circle of 8 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 8 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (8sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (16sts)
3. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join.
4. Finish off the current yarn and change to worsted weight for the background (Sample: Buff). Sl st in the BLO of each st to end of round.
5. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts)
6. Finish off the current yarn and change to worsted weight for the edging (Sample: Orchid). *sl st in the next st, ch 1*, repeat to end of round. Tip: you should sl st in each st around the outer edge with a ch 1 between each. Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing in place.

**“Yarn” Chains**

With a G hook, chain 75 (a little more snug than usual. Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail at the end of the chain.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to pull one end of the chain from back to front, on the edge of the yarn ball where it meets the background. Pull the chain through until a few inches if left on the back. This will be left on the back of the yarn ball.

Lay the chain across the yarn ball. Insert the yarn needle in a space on the opposite side of the yarn ball and pull to the wrong side. Repeat a few times, adding extra “yarn” for dimension. Leaving the remaining chain on top.

With a yarn needle and matching yarn, sew the remaining chain in a squiggle so it stays in place at the base of the yarn ball.

Add a small amount of yarn scraps under the yarn ball before sewing this badge in place. Those will give it just enough body.

Set aside.



Sun Badge**Background**

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Turqua), start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (6sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (12sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (18sts)
4. Ch 1, *sc 2, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts) Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail for wrapping the outer edge and sewing in place.



With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to wrap the yarn around the outer edge.

This is done by inserting the needle in the next st from back to front (or vice versa) and repeated in each st to end of round. The remaining yarn tail will be used to sew the background to the desired project. Set aside.

Sun

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Bright Yellow), start with a magic circle of 7 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 7 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (7sts)
2. *ch 3, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook, sc, sl st in the next st on the circle*, repeat to end of round, creating 7 rays. Finish off and weave in ends.

Center: With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Pumpkin), create a magic circle of 8 hdc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 8 hdc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (8sts) With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to sew the center to the middle of the sun and both to the background.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail from the heart to sew it to the background. Set badge aside.

Smile

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Bright Yellow), start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (6sts)
2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (12sts)
3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (18sts)
4. Ch 1, *sc 2, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts) Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail for wrapping the outer edge and sewing in place.



With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to wrap the yarn around the outer edge. This is done by inserting the needle in the next st from back to front (or vice versa) and repeated in each st to end of round. The remaining yarn tail will be used to sew the background to the desired project.

Face: With a yarn needle and black yarn, stitch the smile and face. Set badge aside.

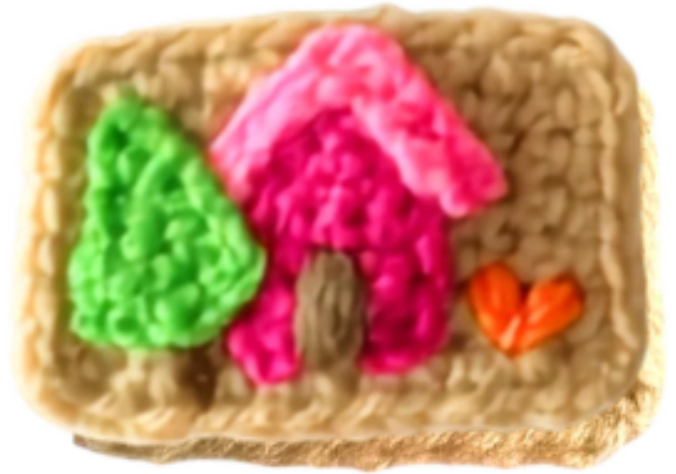


Cabin Badge

I designed this so it could fit 2 houses (one for you and one for you goose) or one house in the middle with a heart on either side, or as shown.

Background

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Buff), ch 7, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (6sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Repeat the previous step for an additional 8 rows.
4. This step is worked around the outer edge. Ch 1, turn, 2sc in the same st, sc 4, 2sc in the last st, sc evening down the side, 2sc in the first st of the bottom row, sc 4, 2sc in the last st, sc evenly up the side, sl st in the first st to join. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

**Cabin - Main**

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Shocking Pink), ch 5, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (4sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row.
3. Repeat the previous row 2 more times.
4. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc2tog. (2sts)
5. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place. Set aside.

Roof: With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Pretty N Pink), ch 12, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook and in in each ch across. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place. Set aside.

Tree

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Spring Green), ch 5, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch. (4sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 2. (3sts)
3. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc. (2sts)
4. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

Place all items on the background. Use a yarn needle and the yarn tails to sew the items in place.

Door and Tree Trunk: With a yarn needle and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Cafe) stitch these items in place.

Heart: With a yarn needle and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Pumpkin), stitch a heart to the side of the cabin.



Goose Foot Badge

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Pumpkin), start with a magic loop of 6 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull closed and place a marker for working in the round. (6sts)

2. *ch 3, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook, hdc in the 3rd ch, sl st in the next st on the circle*, repeat once, ch 3, sl st in the 2nd ch from hook, hdc in the 3rd ch, SC in the next st on the circle, 2hdc in each of the next 2 sts on the circle, sl st to join. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing to the background.

**Background**

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Spring Green), start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (6sts)

2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (12sts)

3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (18sts)

4. Ch 1, *sc 2, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts) Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail for wrapping the outer edge and sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to wrap the yarn around the outer edge of the background circle. This is done by inserting the needle in the next st from back to front (or vice versa) and repeated in each st to end of round. The remaining yarn tail will be used to sew the background to the desired project.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail from the foot to sew it to the background. Set badge aside.

Mug**Background**

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Buff start with a magic circle of 6 sc sts (or preferred method of starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull to close and sl st to join. (6sts)

2. Ch 1, 2sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (12sts)

3. Ch 1, *sc, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (18sts)

4. Ch 1, *sc 2, 2sc in the next st*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (24sts) Finish off, leaving a long yarn tail for wrapping the outer edge and sewing in place.



With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to wrap the yarn around the outer edge. This is done by inserting the needle in the next st from back to front (or vice versa) and repeated in each st to end of round. The remaining yarn tail will be used to sew the background to the desired project.

Set badge aside.

Mug

1. With a G hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Orchid), ch 4, 2sc in the 2nd ch from hook, sc, 2sc in the last ch. (5sts)



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2-3. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 2. (3sts)

4. This step creates the handle. Ch 5, sl st in the bottom edge of the cup. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing in place.

With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail from the mug to sew it to the background.

Heart: With a yarn needle and long piece of worsted weight yarn (Sample: Cherry), stitch a heart shape on the mug.

Set badge aside.

Granny Square

This starts in the middle.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Retro Stripes), ch 4, sl st in the last ch from hook to join in a loop. Ch 2 (counts as a st for this project). Work the following in the circle: 2hdc, ch 2, *3hdc, ch 2*, repeat a total of 3 times, sl st to join.

2. Change yarn colors if desired. Ch 2, TURN, (2hdc, ch 2, 3hdc) in the first space, *(3hdc, ch 2, 3hdc) in the next space*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. Sl st to the corner space.

Optional handle: Ch 8, sl st in the same space. Finish off and weave in ends. If handle is not desired, Finish off the yarn, leaving a yarn tail for sewing the square in place.



Assembly

If they badges will be sewn to the sash I suggest pinning them in place while on the goose if possible. This will help you check placement and direction.
