

Party Pennants



Materials & Details

- Yarn: Worsted weight yarn in a variety of colors.
Yarns used in the sample: 125-200 yards each - RHSS Polo Stripe, Fruity Stripe, Parrot Stripe; 50 yards each - RHSS Shocking Pink, Spring Green, Turqua, Pumpkin
- Crochet Hook: H (5mm)
- Misc: yarn needle, measuring tape, scissors
- Measurements: Large - 10" long x 7.5" across top edge; Small - 5" long x 6" across top edge; Streamers - 16-17" long x 1" wide
- Gauge is not important for this project

Tips - Please read before you begin the project.

- The first stitch of each row is worked into the same stitch as the turning chain unless noted.
- Numbers at the beginning of each line may refer to steps and do not necessarily indicate the number of rows.
- Stitch count remains the same unless noted at end of the row/round.

Suggestions

- These pennants are designed to be strung together.
- Stack a small pennant on top of a small pennant or string each size separately.
- Stitch a letter on each one to spell out different occasions or add your favorite appliques.



Large Pennant (make 1 or many)

1. With an H hook and ww yarn, ch 27, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (26sts)
2. Ch 2, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st across.
3. Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc in each st until 2 sts remain, hdc2tog. (24sts)
4. Keep repeating steps 2-3 until 4 sts remain.
5. Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc2tog. (2sts)
6. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog. (1st)
7. Do not turn. Make sure the sts of this step are not worked too snug. This step is worked around the outer edge of the piece. Ch 1, evenly sl st up the side of the pennant, (sl st, ch 2, sl st) at the corner, sl st in each st across the top of the pennant, (sl st, ch 2, sl st) at the corner. Evenly sl st down the side of the pennant, sl st in the first st to join. Finish off and weave in ends. Set aside.

Small Pennant (make 1 or many)

1. With an H hook and ww yarn, ch 23, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (22sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in each st until 2 sts remain, sc2tog. (20sts)
3. Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.
4. Keep repeating steps 2-3 until 4 sts remain.
5. Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.
6. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc2tog. (2sts)
7. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog. (1st)
9. Do not turn. Make sure the sts of this step are not worked too snug. This step is worked around the outer edge of the piece. Ch 1, evenly sl st up the side of the pennant, (sl st, ch 2, sl st) at the corner, sl st in each st across the top of the pennant, (sl st, ch 2, sl st) at the corner. Evenly sl st down the side of the pennant, sl st in the first st to join. Finish off and weave in ends. Set aside.

Assembly

1. If making the double pennant (one small on top of one big), stack each set together, lining up the top edges, and pin together.
2. With matching yarn, start at the right, top corner of the back pennant. Ch 1, sc in the same st, sc in the next st. Working through both layers, sc in each st across, sc in the last st of the back pennant, sc in the corner. Finish off and weave in the end. Repeat for each pennant/pennant pair.
3. Lay the pennants on a flat surface and decide the order they will hang. With an H hook, attach a color to the first st at the top, right corner of the first pennant. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st across. At this point, continue on to the next pennant or create a chain between each pennant for the amount of distance you would like. For the sample, I chained 10 between each pennant. NOTE: If you want to add the streamers between the pennants as shown in the main photo, it is easier if you have a chain section. Sc in each st across the next pennant. Repeat across all of the pennants, adding the same number of chains between each pair.
4. Ch 1, turn, sc in each st and ch section across. Finish off the current color.
5. With a contrasting color, ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Finish off and weave in ends.

Ties (make 2): These will be attached at each end and used to hang the banner. Decide how long you would like each tie. The sample's ties are 24" long. With an H hook and yarn color of choice, create a chain of 100 sts/24" long (or desired length). Finish off and tie a knot in each end of the chain.



Pull one end of one tie through an outer corner on one end pennant. Pull the end through until the tie ends meet. Repeat for the opposite end.

Streamers (optional to go between the pennants)

1. With an H hook and ww yarn, ch 61, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (60sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 21, ch 3, sk 3, sc 35.
3. Change yarn color if desired. Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across, working 3hdc around the ch space from the previous row. Finish off and weave in ends.

Wrap the streamer around the chain section between the pennants and pull the opposite end through the hole created on step 2.

sc2tog	single crochet 2 sts together
hdc2tog	half double crochet 2 sts together
dc2tog	double crochet 2 sts together
*	repeat instructions
yo	yarn over
