

## FRONT-ROW GOODIE BAG

### Mini Goose Wardrobe Basics

Dress • Coat • Optional Sleeves • Sweater • Little Bag

#### Welcome to the Goodie Bag!

Thanks for joining the first Snappy Fashion Show! These simple wardrobe basics are meant to be mixed, matched and changed up. Switch colors, add tiny accessories and turn one little wardrobe into a whole flock of personalities.



### Backstage Secrets for a Well-Dressed Desk Goose

- Keep a few basic pieces on hand and change accessories for the season. Tiny scraps are perfect for bows, scarves, flowers and patches.
- Try pieces on before fastening anything permanently. One tiny prop can tell the whole story - a book, bag, cup, yarn ball or holiday accessory.
- Keep tiny accessories together in a small container. Goose belongings apparently know the same disappearing trick as stitch markers.



## Coat

This starts at the neck and is worked back and forth in rows to the bottom edge.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (black in sample), ch 19, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (18 sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row. (18 sts)
3. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row. (18 sts)
4. Ch 1, turn, 2 hdc in the same st, hdc in each st until 1 st remains, 2 hdc in the last st. (20 sts)
5. Ch 1, turn, 2 hdc in the same st, hdc in each st until 1 st remains, 2 hdc in the last st. (22 sts)
6. Ch 1, turn, hdc in the same st and in each st to end of row. (22 sts)
7. Ch 1, turn, 2 hdc in the same st, hdc in each st until 1 st remains, 2 hdc in the last st. (24 sts)
8. Ch 1, turn, 2 hdc in the same st, hdc 6, 2 hdc in the next st, hdc 8, 2 hdc in the next st, hdc 6, 2 hdc in the last st. (28 sts)
9. Ch 1, turn, 2 hdc in the same st, hdc 8, 2 hdc in the next st, hdc 8, 2 hdc in the next st, hdc 8, 2 hdc in the last st. (32 sts)
10. Ch 1, turn, 2 hdc in the same st, hdc in each st until 1 st remains, 2 hdc in the last st. (34 sts)
11. This step is worked around the outer edge of the coat. Ch 1. Do not turn. Working down the side of the coat, sc in the top of the previous hdc; sc 10 sts evenly across the side of the jacket; (sc, sl st) in the first st of the beginning row; sl st in each st across until 1 st remains; (sl st, sc) in the last st. Sc 10 sts evenly across the next side of the coat; (sc, hdc) in the first st of the row; 2 hdc in the next st; hdc in each st until 2 sts remain; 2 hdc in the next st; (hdc, sc) in the last st; sl st to join. Finish off and weave in ends. (Edging worked around entire outer edge)

**ASSEMBLY:** Wrap the coat around the goose. For the sample goose, I used a piece of matching yarn and a yarn needle to sew the front edges together approximately 1.5" from the top edge. I just took a couple of stitches and left the rest open.



## Sleeves - Optional

Make 2. This starts at the shoulder.

1. Leave a yarn tail in the beginning for sewing the sleeve to the coat. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn to match the coat (black in sample), start with a magic loop of 6 sc sts (or preferred method for starting a circle of 6 sc sts), pull closed and sl st to join. (6 sts)
2. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (6 sts)
3. Ch 1, 2 sc in the same st, sc 5, sl st to join. (7 sts)
4. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (7 sts)
5. Ch 1, 2 sc in the same st, sc 6, sl st to join. (8 sts)
6. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (8 sts)
7. Ch 1, 2 sc in the same st, sc 7, sl st to join. (9 sts)
8. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (9 sts)
9. Ch 1, FPHDC around each post to end of round, sl st to join. (9 sts)
10. Ch 1, \*sc 2, 2 sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. Finish off and weave in ends. (12 sts)
11. Pull the end of the sleeve back to see the ridge on the inside (created from step 9). With an H hook and white worsted weight yarn, sl st into any st on the ridge. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (9 sts)
12. Ch 1, \*sc2tog, sc\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (6 sts)
13. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc 4, sl st to join. Finish off, leaving a long tail for sewing closed. With a yarn needle, use the yarn tail to weave in and out of the remaining sts. Pull to close and weave in the end. (5 sts)



**ASSEMBLY:** With a yarn needle, use the beginning yarn tail to sew the beginning end of the sleeve to the coat. Repeat for the second sleeve, directly across from the first one.

**HEIDI'S TIP:** I like to sew mine in place so the hands angle towards the middle.



## Dress

Finished size: 2.75" across the top part of the dress (measured flat) x 4" long from top of neck to bottom of skirt.

**BEFORE YOU KEEP GOING:** Make sure to check gauge and compare your goose size with mine. If your goose is a lot bigger than mine, I suggest going up one size hook. If possible, slip the top part of the dress over the goose to check size before continuing with the skirt.

This starts at the top of the dress. Instructions are written for the main pink sample. Substitute colors as desired.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (bright pink in sample), ch 22, sl st in the last ch from hook to join. (22 chs)
2. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
3. Change to a darker color (dark pink in sample). Do not cut the unused yarn. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
4. Change to the original color (bright pink in sample). Do not cut the unused yarn. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
5. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
6. Change to a darker color (dark pink in sample). Do not cut the unused yarn. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
7. Change to the original color (bright pink in sample). Do not cut the unused yarn. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
8. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. Finish off the original color (bright pink in sample). (22 sts)
9. With the darker color, ch 1, \*sc 10, 2 sc in the next st\*, repeat once, sl st to join. (24 sts)
10. Ch 1, \*FPDC around the next post, 2 FPDC around the next post\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36 sts)
11. Ch 4 (counts as the first dc and ch 1), \*dc in the next st, ch 1\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36 dc + 36 ch-1 sps)
12. Ch 4 (counts as the first dc and ch 1), \*dc between the posts below, ch 1\*, repeat to end of round, sl st to join. (36 dc + 36 ch-1 sps)
13. Ch 3, sl st in the next space between sts; repeat to end of round. Finish off and weave in ends. (36 ch-3 loops)



## Bag

This starts at the bottom of the bag.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Cafe), ch 9, sc in the 2nd c from hook and in each ch across. (8 sts)
2. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st and in each st to end of row. (8 sts)
3. This step is worked around the outer edge of the rectangle. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 6, 2 sc in the last st, sc in the side of the rectangle, 2 sc in the first st of the bottom row, sc 6, 2 sc in the last st, sc 2 in the side of the rectangle, sl st in the first st to join. (22 sts)
4. Ch 1, sc in BLO of each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
5. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
6. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
7. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
8. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
9. Ch 1, sc in each st to end of round, sl st to join. (22 sts)
10. Ch 32, sc 10 on bag, sl st in next st. (32 chs + 10 sc)
11. This step creates the flap on the top of the basket. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in the next 11 sts (last st should be in the base of the handle). (12 sts)
12. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 8, sc2tog. (10 sts)
13. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 9. (10 sts)
14. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc 6, sc2tog. (8 sts)
15. Ch 1, turn, sc in the same st, sc 7. (8 sts)
16. Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, hdc 4, sc2tog. Either finish off and weave in ends or continue to the next step to create the buttonhole. (6 sts)
17. Ch 1, turn, sl st 2, (sl st, ch 4, sl st) in the next st, sl st 2. Finish off and weave in ends. (5 sl sts + 1 ch-4 loop)

Fold the flap over to find placement for the button. Use a sewing needle and matching thread to sew the button in place.



## Sweater

This starts at the neck edge and is worked in rounds to the bottom edge.

1. With an H hook and worsted weight yarn (Sample: Burgundy), ch 20, sl st in the last ch from hook to form a circle. Make sure the chain is not twisted. (20 chs)
2. Ch 1, sc in the same ch and in each ch to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (20 sts)
3. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (20 sts)
4. Repeat the previous round for an additional 4 rounds. (20 sts each round)
5. Fold the piece in half matching the sts from the current round to the sts from the beginning ch. Working through sts from both layers, ch 1, \*sc 9, 2 sc in the next st\*, repeat once, sl st in the first st to join. (22 sts)
6. Finish off the current yarns and change to yarn for the chest stripe (Sample: Aran). Ch 1, \*sc 10, 2 sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (24 sts)
7. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (24 sts)
8. Repeat the previous round. (24 sts)
9. Finish off the current yarns and change to yarn for the bottom section (Sample: Burgundy). Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (24 sts)
10. Ch 1, \*sc 11, 2 sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (26 sts)
11. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (26 sts)
12. Repeat the previous round. (26 sts)
13. Ch 1, \*sc 12, 2 sc in the next st\*, repeat to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. (28 sts)
14. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in each st to end of round, sl st in the first st to join. Finish off and weave in ends. (28 sts)

### common CROCHET ABBREVIATIONS

| <b>ch</b>  | chain                 | <b>fp</b>      | front post                     |
| <b>sl</b>  | slip stitch           | <b>blo</b>     | back loop only                 |
| <b>st</b>  | stitch                | <b>flo</b>     | front loop only                |
| <b>sp</b>  | space                 | <b>sc2tog</b>  | single crochet 2 together      |
| <b>sc</b>  | single crochet        | <b>hdc2tog</b> | half double crochet 2 together |
| <b>hdc</b> | half double crochet   | <b>dc2tog</b>  | double crochet 2 together      |
| <b>dc</b>  | double crochet        | <b>yo</b>      | yarn over                      |
| <b>tr</b>  | treble/triple crochet | <b>*</b>       | repeat instructions            |

Abbreviations are written in U.S. crochet terms.

| U.S. LETTER | METRIC (mm) |

| E-4         | 3.5 mm      |
| F-5         | 3.75 mm     |
| G-6         | 4 / 4.25 mm |
| 7           | 4.5 mm      |
| H-8         | 5.0 mm      |
| I-9         | 5.5 mm      |
| J-10        | 6.0 mm      |
| K-10.5      | 6.5 mm      |
| L-11        | 8.0 mm      |
| M/N-13      | 9.0 mm      |
| N/P-15      | 10.0 mm     |
| P/Q-16      | 11.5 mm     |
| Q           | 15.0 mm     |

Hook sizes can vary by brand. When in doubt, the mm size is most accurate!
